

Our Reformation Heritage

Today, we do well to reflect on our great heritage by considering three fundamental principles of the Reformation and therefore of evangelical Protestantism.

The supremacy of Scripture over tradition. The Reformers called Christendom back to the Bible it had all but forgotten. They stressed repeatedly the all-sufficiency of the sacred word. For since God is truth, and since he has spoken in his word, that word is the only infallible rule of faith and life. As against the humanists who went back to the classics and revived the spirit of ancient paganism, the Reformers went back to the Scriptures in the original languages and revived the spirit of apostolic Christianity. And, as against a decadent Romanism for which both Scripture and tradition constituted the rule of faith, Luther boldly affirmed: "I oppose the quotations of all the Fathers...with the Scriptures...The Word of God is supreme to me...in consequence, I care not a fig for it though a thousand Augustines and a thousand churches were opposed to me. I am certain that the true Church clings to the Word of God with me."

The supremacy of faith over works. This was the spark that kindled the fires of the Reformation: "The just shall live by faith." Away with the awful uncertainty bred by a religion of salvation by works! Now the soul could know that "Jesus paid it all." Now, by the faith God freely gives to his own, men could live in the assurance of sins forgiven and the hope of life eternal. "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

The supremacy of the Christian people over an exclusive priesthood. Paul the apostle taught that through Christ we have access by one Spirit unto the Father. As saints, believers are a holy priesthood offering spiritual sacrifices of praise to God. Whether it be with adoration, prayer, praise, or confession, we are privileged to approach boldly the throne of grace through Jesus Christ who is the only Mediator between God and man.
