DAY 1 PHOENIX-BENSON-WILLCOX

Drive from Phoenix to Benson. The drive is 160 mi or 257 km.

Visit Kartchner Caverns State Park.

Experience a stunning limestone cave in Southeastern Arizona that boasts world-class features. This "live" cave, discovered in 1974, is host to a wide variety of unique minerals and formations.



Visit Keeling-Schafer Tasting Room for a tasting in Willcox. Keeling-Schafer produces estate-grown and bottled Rhone-styled wine on their 21 acres of vineyards located along Rock Creek on the western slope of the Chiricahua Mountains in far southeastern Arizona.

DAY 2 WILLCOX-CHIRICAHUA-BISBEE-SIERRA VISTA

Drive from Willcox to the Chiricahuas. The drive is 34 mi or 55 km.

Arrive at the Chiricahua National

Monument, where a "Wonderland of Rocks" is waiting for you to explore. The 8-mile paved scenic drive and 17-miles of day-use hiking trails provide opportunities to discover the beauty, natural sounds, and inhabitants of this 11,985-acre site. See beautiful Ryolite formations, lots of wildlife and the Faraway Ranch.

Drive from the Chiricahuas to Bisbee, AZ. The drive is 71 mi or 115 km.

Experience the Queen Mine Tour and explore one of the oldest copper mines in Arizona. The tour guides, who are former miners, show how turn-of-the-century mines were operated.

DAY 3 SIERRA VISTA-TOMBSTONE-ELGIN-TUCSON





In the morning, hike Ramsey Canyon, a 280-acre National Natural Landmark bestowed to The Nature Conservancy in 1975. The canyon's unique interplay of geology, biology, topography, and climate make it a unique habitat for a variety of plant and animal life with over 170 varieties of birds, including 14 species of hummingbirds.

After your hike, drive from Sierra Vista to **Tombstone**. The drive is 26 mi or 42 km.

Arrive in Tombstone. Head to the O.K. Corral. See Wyatt Earp and Doc Holliday in daily reenactments with life-sized figures of the legendary 1881 gun battle.

Afterwards, take a walk down Allen Street and surrounding areas. Recommended sites to see: Boothill Graveyard, the Bird Cage Theatre, and the Courthouse State Historic Park.

Drive from Tombstone to Elgin. The drive is 35 mi or 56 km.



Stop at <u>Kief-Joshua Vineyards</u> for wine tasting. Kief-Joshua Vineyards is a small family business with 20 acres in beautiful Elgin and 40 acres in Willcox Wine Country. Their Elgin tasting room is open daily and is situated right in the middle of what is known as "winery row."

Sitting on 80 acres, the museum encompasses six indoor exhibit hangars (three dedicated to WWII) and offers docent-led walking tours and exclusive bus tours of the 2,600-acre "Boneyard", a U.S. military and government aircraft storage facility.


