The trip proved transformative in more ways than one. Because here in Arizona, even the sunrises will change your life.



Taliesin West may share a name with Frank Lloyd Wright's Wisconsin masterpiece, but the storied architect's Scottsdale home and school has a feel all its own. "Arizona needs its own architecture," Wright once said, honoring the terrain's low lines and uptilting planes.

A SAND BEACH IN ARIZONA

Our balconies at the refreshed and modern Fairmont Scottsdale Princess faced east, priming us for our new tradition of using the sunrise as the opening curtain on the day. We prolonged the peace with a stroll along the zero-entry pool's white-sand surround, which reminded us of some of our favorite beaches in the tropics. When a pace change seemed in order, on-site restaurant La Hacienda delivered. Our order of cafe flameante, a flaming tableside coffee service that theatrically combines the boost of a coffee with the kick of a drink, spurred the day's cadence in just the right way.

THE WRIGHT PLACE

Most of Frank Lloyd Wright's buildings possess his signature mesmerizing contrast: The structure is at once otherworldly and also entirely of the earth around it. That certainly was the case at Taliesin West, the famed architect's winter home and school where he taught his craft. The muted warmth of the desert masonry mirrored the hues of the surrounding mountains at sunset. Architecturally significant touches, including custom light fixtures and the unmistakable low-slung furniture (much of which Wright designed himself), helped the destination to earn a designation as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We glimpsed room after elegant room that no doubt inspired the brilliance that emanated from within. It was here that Wright students created the Guggenheim Museum draft—and where students study the master's curriculum to this day.

PADDLING FOR POURS

Lush foliage crowds the banks of central Arizona's Verde River. The waterway winds through the Verde Valley, situated above the desert's heat but below the high-country chill, which makes for a happy-grape climate. Vineyards and wineries dot the region, and the river itself hosted our journey to visit one, as part of Sedona Adventure Tours' Water to Wine experience. With gear bags packed for a clothing change upon arrival, we climbed into inflatable kayaks for a scenic float down the river. At some point, every one of us lay back in our kayak, paddle across lap, watching trees and sky pass lazily overhead. After an hour, we emerged at Alcantara Vineyards for a tour and tastings (red, white and rosé) in a Tuscan-style farmhouse.



WATER TO WINE TOUR

Riding a bike around the rim might be the ideal way to see the Grand Canyon. We were close enough to the edge to experience the adrenaline rush of a rugged hike, but we could cover more ground, maximizing the views. Ample pull-offs gave us needed chances to pause—those vistas proved seriously inspiring.

Jovial conversation crackled all around us as our table filled (and refilled) with pizzas fired in a wood oven at Old County Inn in Pine. We couldn't help but notice a contrasting moment of serenity nearby. Chef-owner Michael Dahling checked his watch—"Yeah, it's 6 o'clock"—and grinned as a familiar group of elk ambled by, entirely disinterested in our festive patio party. Hard to believe that anything could resist those pizzas, though. Michael, a CIA-trained New York transplant known to jump in during live

music sets on the patio, layered pies with house-made bacon and local veggies. The green-chile-laced Pancho disappeared particularly quickly. We capped the night with pours in the tiny adjacent Taproom, where the gallery walls of local art extended even across the ceiling.

Later, we strolled like elk into stylish boutique mountain hotel The Strawberry Inn. At this former Dutch-theme shopping strip in nearby Strawberry (hence, the old windmill out front), we tucked ourselves into luxe-sheeted beds, a welcome close to a fulfilling day.

Day 1: Scottsdale

Horseback ride at Cave Creek Outfitters

Cave Creek Outfitters offers rides through both the McDowell Sonoran Preserve and the Tonto National Forest. All group trail rides have a maximum of 6 to 12 riders per group, allowing wrangler or wranglers to provide a personalized experience. Throughout the horseback ride, the wrangler will entertain and educate by talking about horse herd, the desert plant and animal life along the ride, and the lore of the area. Whether you are a seasoned rider or have never been on a horse, Cave Creek Outfitters is a perfect place to experience and feel the spirit of the famous and nameless cowboys, soldiers, pioneers, and outlaws who crossed many of the trails we explore.

Tour Taliesin West

Taliesin West was built by Frank Lloyd Wright and his apprentices in the 1930s and was constantly expanded and modified by the architect until his death in 1959. Wright and his apprentices literally created Taliesin West out of the desert by gathering rocks from the desert floor and sand from the washes to keep the design in balance with the surrounding environment. The site, considered one of the Wright's greatest masterpieces, was designed to serve as Wright's personal home, studio and architectural laboratory. The highlight of this 90-minute guided tour is the dramatic Taliesin West Living Room, called the "Garden Room" by Wright, and the renovated Wright living quarters.

Day 5: Verde Valley – Clarkdale, Jerome & Cottonwood

Tour Tuzigoot National Monument

Crowning a desert hilltop is an ancient pueblo. The pueblo shows us this ancient village built by the Sinagua people. They were farmers and artists with trade connections that spanned hundreds of miles. The view of the Citadel from the southernmost point of the Tuzigoot Trail gives a great deal of perspective on the sheer size of the pueblo. Visit Tuzigoot National Monument and witness the incredible legacy of a people who live in the Verde Valley 1,000 years ago. Set aside a few hours to explore the museum and roam the trails through the Tuzigoot pueblo and Tavasci Marsh.
