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


GRAND CANYON STATE

DAY 1

DOWNTOWN PHOENIX

MORNING

Start your tour in **Downtown Phoenix**. Soak up Phoenix's history and attractions by taking a city tour. After the tour head over to the Bentley Projects. Once a linen laundry warehouse dating back to 1918, this transformed warehouse now displays world class contemporary paintings, photography, sculpture, and prints.

In the afternoon, take a tour of the **Heard Museum**, known for having one of the finest American Indian art collections in the nation.

Insider Tip: Call ahead to make a reservation. This popular restaurant fills up fast!



DAY 2

DOWNTOWN PHOENIX – SCOTTSDALE

MORNING

Depart Phoenix for Scottsdale. The drive is 12.1 miles or 19.4 kilometers. Originally founded in the 1890s as a farming community, Scottsdale has come a long way since its humble beginnings. Scottsdale was coined the "The West's Most Western Town" in the 1950s, but today the city is a modern chic hub for luxurious spas, endless shopping, unparalleled golf courses and world-renowned museums. Plus, you'll find hundreds of locally-owned and -operated restaurants and art galleries.

Scottsdale is home to **Taliesin West**, once Frank Lloyd Wright's winter home. Take the guided tour of this renowned architect's desert masterpiece, now the main campus for the School of Architecture. Next, venture to Scottsdale's the Mix shops at South Bridge, an area for shopping and dining, featuring independent retailers and restaurants that offer eclectic wares and fares.

Take a tour of **Cosanti**. Cosanti is the gallery, studio and residence of Italian-American architect Paolo Soleri, featuring terraced landscaping with experimental earth-formed concrete structures. Soleri is best known for Arcosanti, the prototype "arcology" community founded in the high desert in 1970, approximately 70 miles north of Phoenix. Soleri and his late wife Colly Soleri's residence, Cosanti, was built in 1956 and has been designated as an Arizona historic site.






Take a tour of the **Arizona State University (ASU) Tempe Campus**. On the university's first campus, students enjoy the classic Pac-12 college experience. As a vibrant college town and the campus home to Sun Devil athletics, Tempe is the heart of Sun Devil nation. Students with varied academic interests attend courses in state-of-the-art and solar powered buildings that are home to sustainability, engineering, business, health solutions, education, innovation and interdisciplinary arts and sciences colleges. More than 50,000 students study at this historic campus – ASU was founded in 1885 and opened for classes one year later – where big-time college athletics facilities, high-tech research space and performing arts venues create a dynamic and engaging learning environment.

The tour will include the following buildings, among others:

ASU Art Museum – Cited in Art in America as "the single most impressive venue for contemporary art in Arizona," the ASU Art Museum exhibits contemporary artists, both regional and national, with a focus on Latin American art. The museum also houses the largest collection of Cuban art in the U.S. and an award-winning print collection. Exhibitions change seasonally, and admission is always free.

ASU Gammage Auditorium – This structure, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, resembles a tiered birthday cake and was originally intended to be the royal opera house in Baghdad. The Arizona State University campus is the proud home of this beautiful venue, which hosts world-class concerts and Broadway musicals. While on campus, make time to visit the ASU

Art Museum, considered to be one of the Southwest's most significant contemporary art institutions – and it's free.

Gallery of Scientific Exploration – The **Interdisciplinary Science and Technology Building 4** on the ASU Tempe Campus includes the Gallery of Scientific Exploration, outfitted with kiosk-style interactive exhibits and large-format, high-definition monitors that display video from Earth-observing satellites and robotic probes of other worlds. This first floor gallery invites visitors to explore earth and space sciences through digital media, public lectures, visible laboratories, and interactive displays. The Marston 3-D Theater is a venue for high-definition documentary movies with earth and space science themes and 3-D planetarium-style shows (although on a flat screen). The Gallery of Scientific Exploration also features the meteorite display on the second floor, drawn from the extensive collection of ASU's Center for Meteorite Studies.

AFTERNOON

Enjoy lunch at **Pedal Haus Brewery**. This 14,000 square-foot brewery is Tempe's most bike-friendly environment with a plethora of craft beer selections, sensational lunch and dinner menus and a daily happy hour. You can park yourself in Downtown Tempe's largest patio with yard-style games such as corn hole and ping pong, two indoor-outdoor bars, each with 24 taps, a chef's table, and a cozy stylish lounge.

The park provides five miles of pathways and ample room for festivals or events, such as Ironman Arizona, various charity walks, Oktoberfest, and the July 4th Tempe Town Lake Festival. 



MORNING

Get a taste of Arizona's colorful mining history at the **Goldfield Ghost Town** in the Superstition Mountains. Back in the 1980's, Goldfield boasted 3 saloons, a boarding house, general store, blacksmith shop, brewery, meat market and a school house. After more than 115 years, travelers from all over the world still visit this gold mining town located on the historic Apache Trail.


Drive the Apache Trail (AZ-88) to Canyon Lake or Tortilla Flat. The Apache Trail is one of the most popular day trips in the Phoenix-Metro area. The trail is a scenic route that winds between Apache Junction and Theodore Roosevelt Lake, and through the Superstition Mountains area. With gorgeous, desert views of the Tonto National Forest unlike any other, the Apache Trail is the perfect outdoor excursion. The trail is unpaved starting 5.5 miles past Tortilla Flat. Canyon Lake is home to the Dolly Steamboat, which offers daytime nature cruises and dinner cruises at twilight. Tortilla Flat is a former stagecoach stop that exudes Old West charm.

Depart Apache Junction for Mesa. The drive is 24.7 miles or 39.8 kilometers. Mesa, Arizona is the ultimate Sonoran Desert playground for incredible, sought-after outdoor adventure. Mesa was named the "Best Place for Outdoor Lovers", calling attention to the thousands of acres of natural wonderland surrounding this urban oasis. Visitors can plan for an inspired Arizona getaway on the region's canyon-carved waterways and endless trails. Come hungry and take the ultimate road trip full of Arizona flavors on the award-winning Fresh Foodie Trail®. This in-demand collection of culinary outposts in the shape of farms, citrus groves, peach orchards, an olive mill, wheat fields and more has delights in store for every taste bud.
