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## New Website and Social Media Efforts

Our previous website was over ten years old, used outdated technology and looked the part as well.

Armed with information from a member poll conducted by BMW CCA National as well as the Club's commissioned 2020 Vision project (available on our blog), we set out to develop a new website and much more.

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## Autocross

HAVE YOU WANTED TO TRY OUT AUTOCROSS? Now is your chance. The Porsche Club has graciously invited BMW CCA members to be their guests at their October 15 autocross at Bremerton Motorsport Park.

What is autocross? It is a low to medium speed driving skill contest. Each car is separately timed over a clearly defined forward moving course of slaloms, braking maneuvers and obstacle avoidance. Primary emphasis is placed on driver skill along with car handling and maneuverability rather than raw power or straight-line performance. Speeds should not exceed typical highway speeds. Events occur on an unobstructed expanse of open pavement with orange safety cones defining the course. The low speed and "single car on course" aspects of the sport create a high level of safety for both car and driver. Event structure allows individual choice from a relaxed to a highly competitive atmosphere.

If you have done the car control clinic and are thinking of trying out a high performance driving school, autocross is a great preparation for one of these events and will further develop your car handling skills.

You can pre-register for the event and save \$5 at http://scorekeeper.wwscc.org/register/pca2011/login. Cost is \$30. BMWs will register in the Time Only class. Hope you can join me at what is sure to be a fun event.

## **Club Elections**

It's THAT TIME OF YEAR when we start working on the Club elections for the 2012 Board of Directors. The Club is soliciting members to serve on the Board of Directors for the 2012 calendar year.

The elected positions include: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Coordinator, Roster Manager, Concours Coordinator, Tech Event Coordinator and Tour Coordinator. To be eligible for President you must have been on the Board for the immediately preceding two years. To be Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer, you must have been on the Board for the immediately preceding year. The other positions are open to those who have been Club members in good standing for at least one year.

The four officer positions, President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, have a two-year term limit. The non-officer positions (everything else) have no term limit.

If you would like to be involved in the administration of the Club, we always welcome volunteers. But this isn't simply a matter of coming to a Board meeting once a month and voicing your opinion. The Club has no paid staff. That means everything that happens in this Club happens through the efforts of volunteers. In other words, Board positions mean a commitment to work! That's not to say that involvement in Club administration isn't fun, it is. Most Board members find their work on the Board and with the other Board members to be enjoyable and rewarding.

Here are the duties of the various elected Board positions:

- **President**—Responsible for the overall operation of the Club. Leads Board meetings and makes sure all the other Board members are doing their jobs.
- **Vice President**—Fills in when the President is unavailable. Also responsible for social events not assigned to other Board members.
- Secretary—Records the minutes of Board meetings.
- **Treasurer**—Responsible for the financial affairs of the Club including preparing financial statements, reports to National and the annual tax return.
- **Banquet Coordinator (or annual social event)**—Responsible for the Club's annual social event.
- **Concours Coordinator**—Responsible for all aspects of the Club's annual Concours d'Elegance in July.
- **Membership Coordinator**—Handles mailings to new members and the recruitment of new members. Also picks up the mail at the Club post office box.
- **Roster Manager**—Manages the Club's membership database in coordination with the National office. Provides mailing lists for *Zündfolge* and other mailings.
- **SIG Coordinator**—The Board liaison with the various Special Interest Groups.

**Tech Event Coordinator**—Organizes or facilitates Club technical events. These are usually hosted at a business.

- Tour Coordinator—Organizes or facilitates Club driving tours.
- There are also appointed (rather than elected) Board positions. These include:
- **Risk Management**—Responsible for insurance, risk management and legal issues.
- **Track**—Manages all aspects of the Club's high performance driving education. Track also has two committee members on the Board.
- Web Site Coordinator—Handles everything on the Club's web site.
- **Zündfolge**—Responsible for creation and distribution of the *Zündfolge* plus advertising in the magazine. The *Zündfolge* has two staff members who are on the Board.

Besides Board positions, there are other ways to get involved. One is to just attend Board meetings as a general member. Another way is to get involved with one of the committees that the Club has. These include the track driving events committee, the *Zündfolge* staff and the Concours d'Elegance committee. There is also the opportunity to chair an event such as a general meeting, tour, rally or tech session. Getting involved in one of these committees or chairing an event is probably the best way to find out whether you might enjoy a Board position in the future.

The deadline is October 1. If there are any contested positions, there will be a ballot and candidacy statements in the November/December *Zündfolge*.

Board terms are for the calendar year. Election results will be announced in the February *Zündfolge*.

## 2011 Concours d'Elegance: Divine Intervention

And then there were the cars. A spectacular array of BMWs from the 1950s to current models, with only a sample of BMW's prewar heritage missing. Perhaps next year. Our Featured Model this year was the E90/92/93 M3. We did not have a huge turnout of these cars but what we lacked in numbers was made up for in quality. The most popular variant was the E92 coupe and the most popular color was white, a particularly stunning color on this car. Stephen Poore's 2009 version took home the 1st Place trophy in the Featured Model class.

There were nine classes in total including the Vintage cars. I won't go through the whole list of winners since that information is listed in the sidebar (page twelve). I will mention a few highlights.

Keith Fournier has won the Early 3 Series class almost every year, and has added Best of Show a number of times, with his stunning E30 M3. This car is one of the first M3s brought into Washington State and it is in near perfect original condition. It is a museum piece that gets driven. We've had some frustration that nobody can beat Keith; can't we disqualify him so someone else can win? We've always said that someone has to beat Keith on merit. This year somebody did. John Parker, after losing to Keith last year, made it his

The other two Munich Evo cars were a lovely Z8 and an M1 in Henna. The M1 was purchased only a week before the show from the former owner of BMW of Bellevue. It is an original, low mileage example in just about perfect condition. The car is a stunner, a worthy winner of the Griot's Garages Preservation Award.

Another Vintage Class vehicle won the Peoples' Choice Award. This was Brown Maloney's drop dead gorgeous 1958 BMW 507. It may look black in the photos but the paint is actually a very dark blue. The car is as new, having been restored by TT Workshops in England, and is one of the finest 507s in the world.

Still another Vintage Class car deserves mention. Tom and Barb Chandler from Iowa brought their 1954 Bristol 403 to the event. Bristols from this era are basically a continuation of pre-war BMWs, even using the BMW 2.0-liter engine and having kidney grills. ## The Crush of July and the Push into Fall

MANY OF YOUR FELLOW CLUB MEMBERS who either race in PRO3, or support a PRO3 car, are currently taking a well-earned break from racing as I write this. July was the busiest racing month we have had in the PRO3 ranks since the inception of the class in 2003.

Between the three weekends from July 15 to July 31, PRO3 racers had the opportunity to participate in seven PRO3 races (as well as a special race in Spokane, and five EIP races). There were approximately 180 PRO3 entries tallied for these three weekends; more than the yearly entry counts for 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007. For those keeping track, just the PRO3 races represent roughly one-half of a typical conference season of racing! And given the condensed timeline of the races, this did not leave much room for car repairs and improvements. All in all, it was a crush of racing for the month of July. Believe me, though, no one I spoke with is complaining!

By far, the biggest weekend of those three was the Bi-Mart 125 NASCAR K&N Racing West Series support race in Portland. PRO3, for the second year, was invited to participate with the NASCAR series as a support race for the weekend. PRO3 provided the race promoter with an additional reason to draw more people to the seats in the stands. Last year's event was a great time and we introduced PRO3, the BMW CCA, and club racing through ICSCC to an entirely different demographic that

may not have known about any of those three entities. This year, we discovered that many of the returning NAS-CAR fans not only remembered us, but commented on how great a show we put on and were looking forward to more of the same this year!

Not ones to disappoint, thirty-eight PRO3 drivers took to the track tuning and tweaking our cars in anticipation of the two races we were allotted. Our format for this event is slightly different than a typical Conference weekend. We qualified Saturday morning for a thirtyminute qualifying race that afternoon. The qualifying race, although not a typical race as we are used to, was nothing short of a very tight PRO3 battle on track. Every one of the drivers understood the importance of not just

making a single fast lap, but making multiple fast laps and keeping a hold of your position for the entire thirty minutes. In this group, that is a very difficult task! It was pointed out by our PRO3 race steward, Dan Heinrich, that during the qualifying race, the fast lap times were separated from first to last by a mere four seconds. That represents some very close, tight racing on track.

Sunday's events were more surreal for our drivers and crew. Where Saturday felt more like a Conference race weekend, Sunday was like watching a race on TV. There were fans circulating around, asking for autographs, the food vendors were in full swing, the NASCAR boys were polished and ready and on full display, and the paddock was absolutely electrified

with anticipation of the day's events that were about to

happen. The PRO3 race was the first on the schedule and if you haven't had the chance to see thirty-eight E30s in full race trim, all lined up twoby-two on pregrid, well, it's a very cool sight to see! Our drivers did an outstanding job keeping the grid in order as the pace car left the group at T12. We marched to the anticipated green flag under the pace of Andrew Newell, who held PRO3 Pole Position. There are pictures and video that show Turn 1 with five cars wide after the green flag. There are pictures later in the race that still show three cars wide through T1. And, with

the possible exception of a couple of bumps and taps, everyone ran a clean race.

Lance Richert, the organizer of the event and generally the man in charge of PRO3 for the weekend. had arranged for five special plates to be made as trophies for the first through fifth place finishers. The coveted plates were awarded at our own podium ceremony which was a great way to cap off an awesome weekend. Anticipation before the race was high for Andrew Newell to make a repeat of his performance in 2010 and take first place again this year, what with being on the Pole, but Caelin Gabriel had other plans and the two drivers had a very

close, tight race for forty-five minutes.

Your top five finishers were: Caelin Gabriel (#60), Andrew Newell (#166), Michael Olsen (#130), Jeff Van Lierop (#59), and Dan Rogers (#102).

The racing action was certainly a highlight for all of us drivers, but based on the pre-race jibber-jabber on the PRO3 email board, there were many racers anticipating the autograph session even more than the racing. Apparently, the addition of umbrella girls to our race schedule suddenly made the weekend all the more important! Our drivers signed hundreds of copies of the PRO3 spotters guide showcasing the participating PRO3 cars of the weekend. There are a few signed spotters guides available, if you can locate one (check with a driver), or there are plenty of unsigned copies available as well.

On the business side of the coin, the conference season is starting its push into the fall months with the final few races starting to show up on the horizon. A double race in Mission, BC over Labor Day weekend, a race at ORP on September 18, and the final event in Seattle

on September 25 will roundout the 2011 racing season.

Our final event of the year is the Eight-Hours of the Cascades Endurance Race held in Portland on October 15. For those keeping track of points, you will notice in the accompanying sidebar that there is once again a rather tight points battle shaping up in the top five. With just four races to go, each race becomes increasingly important.
