that will accompany your articles too.



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



2008 Driving Events

It's March and that means our high performance driving school season begins! In February we had our annual Instructor's Clinic, hosted by the Porsche club this year. We share instructors and alternate hosting this event with the Porsche guys.

March 1 is the date for our Car Control Clinic at Bremerton. This is our only Bremerton event of the year; we just couldn't get any other dates. However, BMW CCA members have the opportunity to attend similar events held by other local car clubs. The adjacent 2008 Driving Events Calendar includes many such events open to you.

On Sunday, March 16, it is back to Pacific Raceways and a real road-racing course. This is also our only weekend date for 2008 at PR.

After that, you'll have to call in sick to do BMW CCA schools at PR. The only other dates we were able to obtain are weekdays. On April 11 we'll be there on Friday. Our May 1 date is a Thursday and then we've got another Friday on July 11.

All registration for Club driving schools is now done online. You can go to www.MotorsportsReg.com directly, or via a link on the Club's website.

Requirements

- 1. To participate in track events you must be a Club member or a member of a reciprocal club. Those include PCA, BMW ACA, BMW CCBC and NWARC.
- 2. You must be 18 year of age or older and have a valid driver's license.
- 3. Your car must pass a technical inspection within thirty days prior to the event. The tech form is available on the Club website.
- 4. You must wear a helmet while driving. A Snell 2000 or newer rated helmet is required. We have a limited number of helmets to use.
- 5. You must drive a car with a fixed roof. No convertibles are allowed at our track events.
- 6. You must attend a Car Control Clinic before coming to a school at Pacific Raceways.

Once you register for any of these events, you will receive a full information package including directions to the track, what to bring, what time to be there, etc.

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Sam Posey on Pacific Raceway



The January/February issue of *Vintage Motorsport* has an article on "My Favorite Race" about Sam Posey. It turns out that Sam Posey's favorite race was at Pacific Raceways in the 1969 USAC Dan Gurney 200. This was an Indy car race and included the likes

of Mark Donohue, Mario Andretti, Al Unser, Sr. and Dan Gurney.

Here is how Posey describes the track: "Kent had a kind of Wagnerian feel to it with the rains and winds whipping these magnificent pines and sequoias (or at least Douglas Firs).

Kent had a kind of Wagnerian feel to it . . . It's a very bracing place. You can feel the sea in the air.

Every now and then there would be a clearing and you could see Mt. Rainier in the distance. It's a very bracing place. You can feel the sea in the air. I found it wonderful. It has a long straightaway which they use for drag racing, and then a long sweeping left which takes you into a downhill section that is right out of the Nürburgring. It's one of those tracks where you feel like you've been somewhere on a lap, where you're not just going around in circles."

This is the best description I've ever read of Pacific Raceways. And almost forty years later, little has changed. This is where you will drive at our high performance driving schools.

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




Richard Griot's Ultimate Garage



FOR DON AND DONNA KITCH, what started twelve years ago as a one time effort to raise money for the Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center turned into over a decade of work and over three million dollars in contributions to the hospital. This year, over a 24-hour period from January 26 to 27, two GT cars driven by Team Seattle veterans completed nearly 1,200 total laps and gathered nearly 500,000 dollars in pledges from donors around the country (final numbers are still coming in as of this deadline).

In every way, this final effort was a huge success. Team Seattle fielded two cars and eight drivers, all of who had driven at Daytona in the past. With two very well

Several BMW Puget Sound Region members





Video Killed the Radio Star

WE HAD GREAT ROCK BANDS in the late seventies: Journey, Boston, Heart and the list goes on. Then in 1981 a little thing called MTV was born. MTV exposed us to a new sound in Rock and Roll; bands such as A Flock of Seagulls, Duran Duran, Boy George and the list goes on.

This was a really monster change in the music industry, and largely due to technology that allowed the music industry to create bands in the studio. These bands did not have to sound good because the studio would make them sound great. This was a big change from the pre-MTV bands. They had to sound great because the only exposure they got was from massive concert tours. They sounded great live because they could actually perform the music we heard on the radio.

Technology has also changed many things in the automotive industry over the years. Most of them were very good changes. Think of things like power steering, disc brakes and improved suspension systems, of course the list goes on. Much like the music industry creating bands that looked and sounded better than they really were, automotive technology is approaching that same point with our cars.

A recent article in Bimmer Magazine compared the new BMW 550 to the new M5. The author was Klaus Schnitzer, one of my BMW heroes. He made the point several times that the new "driver assist" technologies in these cars are a blessing and a curse. There are many differing schools of thought with regard to Active Steering, Active Cruise and Active Suspension.

I have said before and I will say again, I'm not against technology. After all, I'm a technical engineer during my working hours. Having said that, sometimes I think just because we have the technology to do something does

not necessarily mean we should. I have discussed "Push Technology" (where the dealer has the ability to push software updates to our cars) in prior articles, which caught the attention of Satch Carlson. I am not going to go into that again because I already covered it; I do think that push technology should not be utilized just because we can. Anyway, I digress.

The E28 and E30 are good examples of cars that can be driven hard without the assistance of a computer system. We don't need technology that makes us better drivers than we actually are. It's too much like creating a band in a studio. Don't get me wrong, I love traction control: it has saved my bacon many times. Case in point though, in my E28 535is I can only push the car so far before it pushes back. In some of the newer BMWs I have owned, I can push the car beyond my abilities due to the car's abilities.

Again I am not saying that we should not incorporate some of these driver nannies; I am simply saying where and when do we say, "Enough is enough!" In the future the cars we love to drive may drive themselves, taking the enthusiast completely out of the picture. I consider my driving abilities somewhere between the Eagles and Chaka Khan. I have never had a hit on the radio but have been known to make a video or two.

Run-Flat Tires Are Repairable

I DRIVE A BMW 650i with 19-inch run-flat tires. A short time ago, the tire monitor flashed the dreaded "Flat Tire" message. I stopped immediately to see if a tire really was low. I didn't see one that was obviously flat, so I proceeded to my destination about a mile away. I finished my errand quickly and hustled home to check the pressure in all the tires. One tire was about ten psi lower than the others. I inspected it carefully and found a nail in it. As luck would have it, it was in the center of the tread.

I have read several articles indicating that run-flat tires are not repairable and must be replaced at considerable expense, approximately \$350. I called the Les Schwab Tire Center about three miles from my home and asked if this type of tire was repairable. I told them that the tire monitor indicated the tire was flat, but it still had about 25 psi in it. They said, "It depends, but often the tire can be repaired if it isn't damaged." Feeling cautiously optimistic, I headed for the tire center after I pumped the tire to 5 psi over the recommended pressure to avoid damaging the sidewalls.

While I was waiting, a fellow customer said, "My wife has a 650i and I didn't think the tires were repairable." I said, "Well, these folks said often they can be repaired, so we'll see."

After an agonizing one-hour wait, the tire was repaired. The tire technician said the tire had a long nail through the tread; fortunately, it was near the center of the tread and not near a sidewall. I breathed a huge sigh of relief and was happy to pay the \$10 repair fee.

To maximize the chance of keeping the run-flats repairable, I purchased the Emergency Tire Repair Kit from Griot's Garage. I also purchased a 12-volt tire pump. I carry these in the trunk so I can keep a punctured tire inflated long enough to get to a tire store.

I trust this will give those of you who have run-flats on your Bimmer some hope and a couple of ideas on how to maximize the chance that a puncture can be repaired.
