


BOOK CLUB DISCUSSION

Why does feeling like you belong matter?




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BOOK CLUB DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



This story involves a mix of adventure, mystery, and friendship. Which aspect of the story resonated with you the most? Which character would you most like to be friends with? Why?



The core elements of a good mystery include: Detective, Crime, Victim, Suspect(s), Motives, & Clues. Discuss how each of these elements shows up in this story. Were you surprised by who actually hurt Mr. Griswold?



Discuss the importance of hidden codes & puzzles in the story. How did they enhance the suspense and intrigue, and what impact did they have on the characters?



Friendship and collaboration are big themes. Give examples of how characters worked together to solve problems. Reflect on this quote from Hollister about Mr. G. "Similar interests, different priorities." Compare the friendship challenges between Emily & James with those between Hollister & Mr. G.




Describe a time when a character had to make a difficult ethical decision. Would you have returned the book right away if a teacher had told you to?




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ACTIVITY IDEAS
