Subject: Leachate Spill Report

Chiquita Canyon Landfill

File No. 67-020

Out of an abundance of caution and in an effort to be transparent, Chiquita Canyon, LLC ("Chiquita") voluntarily provides the following information regarding an incident that occurred on June 12, 2025 at the Chiquita Canyon Landfill, during which no more than (1) gallon of treated leachate spilled outside of the landfill's footprint and did not reach the stormwater channel or either stormwater basin. The volume of the spill is a conservative estimate based on visual observation by Chiquita staff. Chiquita has appropriate spill response materials, including fully stocked spill kits, and trained staff on site to respond to spills and to prevent seeps from entering the stormwater system.

i. Map - A map showing the location(s) of spillage.

The spill occurred at the exit scale of the scale house, as indicated in Attachment A.

ii. Flow rate - An estimate of the flow rate.

The spill had a low flow rate.

iii. Description - A description of the nature of the discharge (e.g., all pertinent observations and analyses).

On June 12, 2025, at approximately 4:45 a.m., to the best of Chiquita's knowledge, a third-party haul truck drove down the hill to the scale house and leveled out, which caused a loose cap on the end of the hose from the haul truck scrubber to spill approximately one (1) gallon of treated leachate from the hose onto the outbound scale outside of the scale house. The spill was the fault of the driver and did not reach the stormwater channel or either stormwater basin. The liquid was dark brown in color with low viscosity, and traveled as a light trickle.

iv. Location – Location of sample(s) collected for laboratory analysis, as appropriate.

No sampling of this spill was conducted.

v. Corrective measures – approved (or proposed for consideration) by the Regional Board Executive Officer.

Chiquita took prompt action to address the spill by tightening the loose cap. Chiquita then applied absorbent to the affected area, which was later removed. Cleanup was completed on the same day. To prevent a similar spill in the future, Chiquita tank farm staff will ensure all caps are properly secured onto the hoses of the trucks.
