- Proper opening with solid method of speaking. Alternates between strong speaking tone and occasional factually informal voice. Provides fair examples and professional tone. Moderate eye contact.
- Manages to defend points weakly during cross examination. Stumbles slightly and exhibits slight confusion and miscommunication during crosses.
- Opens rebuttal casually. Slowly begins to use more powerful tone to reiterate initial points which were contested by opponent. Attacks opponent's strong arguments with little to moderate success. Moderate eye contact.
- Opens final rebuttal clearly claims middle by opponent. Makes moderate to solid attacks against opponent, gaining some ground finally.

- Enters cross examination strongly containing opponent's points. Successfully prevented opponent from holding contentious solid. Was able to poke holes in opponent's knowledge of subject.
- Makes highly efficient use of immensely powerful speaking voice. Provides solid tone when stating solidified arguments in a proper method. Uses effective real world examples. Tone is moderately rapid, but not rapid enough to lose efficiency. Very effective at establishing control over audience. Moderate to high eye contact.
- Aggressively enters rebuttal, attacking enemy's points and pointing out an immense lack of rebuttal from opponent. Strongly reinforces own case in addition to announcing complete lack of successful rebuttal. Uses powerful voice and intensely high eye contact.

- Takes advantage of every opportunity during rebuttal to lay waste to what opponent's major points. Establishes total domination of floor and successfully attempt to secure control over target audience. With total eye contact throughout.
- Uses final rebuttal to finalize defeat of opponent's claims. Establishes finally that opponent conceded key points and claims. Was first ground and leads on to prove why case is accepted in debate as closed for the affirmative.
- Opens cross examination, weakly failing to gain any ground. Opponent successfully defends against all attempts.
- Casually opens construction, slowly establishing contentions and providing foundation and examples. Little to some eye contact. Attempts to defend with weak real world example.
- Uses opening of rebuttal to reestablish solid ground for case. With moderate finesse, reinforces certain contentions as solidified. Fails to prove anything against opponent's case.
