Registration & Fees

Registration deadline is Tues, Dec. I. Drop deadline is Thurs. Dec. 3.

Tournament fees are as follows:

School Fee: \$50 Fee per debater: \$25

No fees for coaches and judges; please avoid large numbers of observers because

Yaatly charges us.

Uncovered Team Fee: \$150

Each school needs to provide N-I judging (with a minimum of I judge) to ensure that every room of debate has a multi-judge panel.

Judging you need: I team = I judge; 2 teams = I judge; 3 teams = 2 judges; 4 teams = 3 judges; 5 teams = 4 judges, etc.

We encourage you to reach out to women and people of color to judge. We want a strong, diverse judging pool.

Tentative Schedule

Go to your debate room.

Topic announced on Yaatly.

5 minutes prep.

Each debater gives a 1 minute speech.

Judges adjudicate and explain decision for 5 minutes maximum.

Round 0 does not count but if you are not in the round, you will be removed from the tournament.

Round 0 is expressively for assuring teams are familiar with Yaatly, are in attendance, and so that we can help with tech issues.

Late debater? Iron person with the debater that is there. Otherwise, we have to drop the missing team and replace them with an SU iron person.

Report missing teams and tech problems ASAP-immediately.
