A Resolution to Transition to Statehood

- 1 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States states, "The Congress shall have Power to
- 2 dispose of and make all needful Rules and Regulations respecting the Territory or other Property
- 3 belonging to the United States" (Article IV, Section 3, Clause 2); and
- 4 WHEREAS, The U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico passed in November 2020 a referendum to become
- 5 the 51st state; and
- 6 WHEREAS statehood would increase local job opportunities; and
- 7 **WHEREAS** No valid petition for statehood has ever been denied by the United States Congress; now,
- 8 therefore, be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled recommends the 46th President of the United
- 10 States issue a proclamation on January 20, 2021, to begin the transition process that will result
- 11 in Puerto Rico's admission as a state effective January 1, 2023.

A BILL TO SECURE AMERICA'S NUCLEAR WASTE

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 SECTION 1A: The United States Federal Government (USFG) authorize long-term interim
- 3 storage of radioactive spent nuclear fuel at private storage facilities.
- 4 **SECTION 1B:** Temporary deep-water storage of spent nuclear fuel will continue at the nearly
- 5 80 nuclear facilities across the nation. Temporary storage of spent material shall not exceed 10
- 6 years; at which point material must be transferred to interim storage facilities.
- 7 **SECTION 2A:** Additionally, the USFG will resume design and construction of the permanent storage site at
- 8 Yucca Mountain in Nevada as the final and permanent storage site of all spent nuclear materials.
- 9 SECTION 2B: For each dollar spent towards creating this site, the US Treasury will fund one dollar towards the
- 10 National Institute of Health to establish a medical clinic, as well as a cancer research facility, near Yucca
- 11 Mountain.
- 12 SECTION 4: Any construction of private interim storage facilities on Native Land will still be under the
- 13 jurisdiction and regulation of U.S. government agencies.
- 14 **SECTION 5**: The U.S. Department of Energy will license and regulate all private interim
- 15 storage facilities and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Agency will supervise construction
- 16 standards for all storage facilities.
- 17 **SECTION 6:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement Universal Basic Income

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 WHEREAS; Universal Basic Income will promote economic growth.
- 3 SECTION 1: The United States Federal Government will give \$1,000 per month to every
- 4 single citizen 18 years and older.
- 5 **SECTION 2A:** This program will be funded by the implementation of a 10 percent Value Added Tax.
- 6 SECTION 2B: A Value-Added Tax (VAT) is a tax on the production of goods or services a
- 7 business produces.
- 8 **SECTION 3:** The Department of Labor will implement this legislation.
- 9 SECTION 4: This bill shall go into effect on January 1st, 2023.
- 10 **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

THIS LEGISLATION IS FOR SEMIFINALS

A Resolution to Support Taiwan in Joining the World Health Organization

- 1 WHEREAS, Taiwan has been successful in combatting the coronavirus; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Global health has clearly become a major concern for the future; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Democracy continues to grow stronger in Taiwan; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The US and Taiwan have long been allies and relations continue to improve; and
- 5 **WHEREAS**, Taiwan's participation in the World Health Organization could bolster future response to global 6 pandemics; now, therefore, be it
- 7 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that the US supports Taiwan's bid to join the World Health 8 Organization.

THIS LEGISLATION IS FOR SEMIFIANLS

A Bill to Ban the Use of Chemical Weapons in Policing

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 SECTION 1. United States law enforcement officers may not use chemical weapons in policing.
- 3 A. Federal law enforcement officers may not use a chemical weapon in the course of policing
- 4 activities in the United States.
- B. In order for a state or local unit of government to be eligible to receive funds under the
- 6 Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Acts of 1968, the unit of government shall have a law or
- 7 policy in place prohibiting the use of chemical weapons in the course of law enforcement officers'
- 8 policing activities in that jurisdiction and be in substantial compliance with that policy.
- 9 SECTION 2. "Chemical weapon" shall be defined in accordance with 18 U.S.C. § 229F.
- 10 **SECTION 3**. The Department of Justice will administer and enforce this legislation.
- 11 **SECTION 4**. This legislation will be implemented one year after its enactment.
- 12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

THIS LEGISLATION IS FOR FINAL ROUND

A Bill to Enact Compulsory Voting

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1**. Every constituent over the legal age 18 is required to cast a ballot for federal, state, and local 3 elections.
- 4 SECTION 2. All those in non-compliance of this legislation will face a fine of \$20 per missed ballot.
- 5 **SECTION 3**. The Federal Election Committee (FEC) should oversee the implementation of this legislation, and 6 therefore administer the fines.
- 7 **SECTION 4**. This legislation will go into effect amid the 2024 elections.
- 8 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby considered null and void.

THIS LEGISLATION IS FOR FINAL ROUND

A Bill to Give Assistance to Yemen

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1.** The federal government shall give 800 million dollars in aid to Yemen in response to its ongoing 3 humanitarian crisis.
- 4 SECTION 2. Humanitarian aid shall be defined as but is not limited to food, clean water, shelter, sanitation
- 5 services, and medical services and equipment.
- 6 SECTION 3. The Office of Foreign Assistance and USAID in conjunction with UNICEF and the World Health
- 7 Organization shall be responsible for the implementation and oversight of this legislation.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 1, 2021.
- 9 **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
