

# A Bill to Implement Medicare for All

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

**SECTION 1.** Medicare will be reformed such that all US residents will be provided with free medicare, and will be covered at birth or residency in the United States. It will cover any items or services that are medically necessary.


- A. Every US citizen of all ages will be covered by this bill, and any insurance services similar to this bill's functions will be henceforth banned.
- B. This bill will be funded through cutting the military budget by a quarter, and paying the rest through taxes on individuals with incomes over \$30,000 dollars per year.

**SECTION 2.** A "medical necessity" will be defined as items or services that a physician or doctor prescribes or serves to the patient for the purpose of evaluating, diagnosing, or treating an illness, injury, disease, or its symptoms.

**SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

**SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2022.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



## **A Bill to Reduce Carbon Dioxide Emissions by Implementing a Carbon Tax**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

**SECTION 1.** A carbon tax shall be imposed on all U.S. citizens at a base rate of \$20 per metric ton of carbon (with adjustment for inflation) that will increase by a rate of 5% yearly until 20% of carbon emissions have been cut relative to 2021 levels. 90% of this tax revenue will go to the EPA while the remaining 10% will go to TANF.


**SECTION 2.** This tax will be levied midstream, so taxable groups include:

- A. Upstream organizations like coal suppliers, oil refineries, natural gas processing facilities
- B. Midstream organizations like electrical utilities

However the downstream sector that includes households and vehicles will not. In example, carbon-based fuels like coal, natural gas, gasoline, and oil are taxable. Midstream services and goods will be taxed, such as electricity, but upstream goods are not taxable.


**SECTION 3.** The EPA shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

**SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on December 1st, 2021.



## **A BILL TO PROVIDE FREE MASKS FOR ALL**

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** Free masks must be given to those who don't or can't afford a mask. It must be only  
3 obtained when in public or risking the lives of others.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** Risking the lives of others may be defined as:
- 6 A. Not social distancing  
7 B. Not wearing masks  
8 C. Unable to obey the guidelines issued by the CDC(Centers for Disease  
9 Control and Prevention)
- 10 **SECTION 3.** The government should allow police, patrols, and security to follow issued commands  
11 from the department of health and services.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** This will go into effect in 15 days of it being passed, but the time of the law in effect may 14  
be extended.
- 15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Raise the Minimum Wage

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:


**SECTION 1.** The US federal minimum wage shall be raised from \$7.25 an hour to \$15 an hour. The minimum wage will thereafter be indexed to inflation.

**SECTION 2.** The federal minimum wage is defined as the lowest hourly wage that a business or a corporation is allowed to pay its employees, except in specific instances already outlined by the federal law. After the minimum wage is \$15, it shall be readjusted annually for inflation using the Consumer Price Index.

**SECTION 3.** This bill will be enforced by the US Department of Labor.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1st, 2022.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Provide Free School Meals For All

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:


**SECTION 1.** A. Free school meals shall be offered at all public U.S. preschools, elementary, middle, and high schools so that (1) all students can eat the food needed, (2) there is no pressure on students to worry about the costs of their foods, (3) students can eat breakfast, lunch, and dinner offered by the school for free, and (4) in any case of students being full, they may take the food home. B. During the first year, all students in a family with low income ( $\leq$  \$20,000 made per year) will automatically be provided with free meals; during the second year, all preschool students will automatically be provided with free meals; during the third year, all elementary and middle school students will automatically be able to eat free meals; by the fourth year, every preschool, elementary, middle, and high school student in the U.S. will be able to have free school meals.

**SECTION 2.** “The food needed” shall be defined as the average necessary calories per day for students: a 4-8-year-old male needs 1400 kcal/d, a 4-8-year-old female needs 1200 kcal/d, a 9-13-year-old male needs 1800 kcal/d, a 9-13-year-old female needs 1600 kcal/d, a 14-18-year-old male needs 2200 kcal/d, and a 14-18-year-old female needs 1800 kcal/d, according to [American Heart Association](#).

**SECTION 3.** The Department of Education shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect on August 19, 2021.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Hold Saudi Arabia Accountable for the Yemeni Crisis

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

**SECTION 1.** The United States shall terminate all transfers of aircraft, missiles, and strategic intelligence to Saudi Arabia until their military action against Yemen ceases.

- A. Funds previously allocated to Saudi Arabian weaponry will be directed to NGOs providing humanitarian relief in Yemen in categorical grants.
- B. The United States shall terminate all strategic intelligence transfers to countries which continue to provide Saudi Arabia with weapons or intelligence. Intelligence transfers will be resumed when a country ends its aid to Saudi Arabia or once Saudi Arabia ends its military initiatives in Yemen.

**SECTION 2.** Aircraft are defined as machines capable of flight. Missiles are defined as self-explosive projectiles and their targeting systems. Strategic intelligence is defined as information used to form policy or military strategies.

**SECTION 3.** The United States Department of State shall be tasked with the enforcement of this legislation.

- A. The United States Agency for International Development will determine which NGOs shall receive grants.
- B. The Senate Committee on Armed Services shall determine the appropriate time to resume transfers of military and intelligence resources with Saudi Arabia.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect at the beginning of fiscal year 2021.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
