A Bill to Increase the Inheritance Tax

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: The following reforms shall be made to the U.S.
- 3 inheritance tax: A. The Estate Tax exemption will be reduced
- 4 to \$3 million. B. All assets above and beyond \$3 million,
- 5 excluding those omitted in the Estate Tax exemption, will be
- 6 taxed at 45%. C. A pre-death capital gains tax will be
- 7 realized before the beneficiary receives the inheritance.
- 8 Section 2: A pre-death capital gains tax shall be defined as the
- 9 taxation of the growth in value of assets, realized at the time
- 10 of death of the original owner, before the beneficiary inherits
- 11 the assets.
- 12 Section 3: The Internal Revenue System will oversee the enforcement
- 13 of this legislation.
- 14 Section 4: This legislation will go into effect January 1, 2022.
- 15 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 16 declared null and void.

A Resolution to Increase Investment in Nuclear Energy

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 WHEREAS, 1: Current dependence on oil and natural gas is
- 3 unsustainable, but solar and wind technology are not ready to
- 4 power large swaths of the United States, while nuclear energy
- 5 both produces little harm to the environment and has the
- 6 capacity to produce adequate power; and
- 7 WHEREAS, 2: Wind and solar power produce energy an approximate 35%
- 8 and 25% of the time, respectively, while nuclear plants operate
- 9 at full capacity about 93% of the time, resulting in efficacy
- 10 rates that are over 1.5 times higher than production reaped
- 11 from natural gas; and
- 12 WHEREAS, 3: WHEREAS, The use of oil, coal, and natural gas has
- 13 resulted in rampant pollution, permanently threatening the
- 14 health of Americans and the long-term sustainability of
- 15 ecosystems, necessitating a high-capacity energy production
- 16 alternative; and
- 17 WHEREAS, 4: If carbon emissions continue at their current rate, sea
- 18 levels are predicted to rise another 2 inches, endangering the
- 19 lives of an approximate 10 million people and causing
- 20 irreversible damage that will demand retrospective and
- 21 reparative action to mitigate harms; now, therefore, be it
- 22 WHEREAS, 5: That the Congress here assembled make the following
- 23 recommendation to the Environmental Protection Agency and
- 24 individual states to prioritize funding in the nuclear energy
- 25 sectors.

A Bill to Ban Unpaid Internships

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: The United States shall act to ban unpaid internships in
- 3 the private sector and establish a minimum wage for interns in
- 4 replacement.
- 5 Section 2: An "unpaid internship" is the position of a student or tra
- 6 inee who works at a trade or occupation in order to gain work
- 7 experience yet receives no monetary compensation in exchange.
- 8 The "private sector" is the part of the economy which is run by
- 9 vate individuals or groups, usually as means of enterprise for
- 10 profit, and is not controlled by the government.
- 11 Section 3: A minimum wage of \$5.25 per hour will be established for
- 12 interns. A. The change in labor laws shall be overseen by the
- 13 United States Department of Labor in conjunction with the
- 14 Department of Justice. B. Companies failing to abide by this
- 15 bill after January 1, 2022 will be susceptible to future civil
- 16 lawsuits.
- 17 Section 4: This bill will take effect no later than January 1,
- 18 2022.
- 19 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 20 declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Funding for NASA

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: The United States shall double the funding of the
- 3 National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) of \$19.5
- 4 Billion USD to \$39.1 Billion USD for the purpose of the
- 5 administration's goal of human exploration.
- 6 **Section 2:** "Human Exploration" shall be defined as expanding human pre
- 7 sence into the solar system and to the surface of Mars to
- 8 advance exploration, science, innovation, benefits to humanity,
- 9 and international collaboration.
- 10 Section 3: The Implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the
- 11 Congressional Budget Office in coordination with the Department
- 12 of Defense. A. All means of funding shall be allocated from the
- 13 United States Military Budget. B. The withdrawal and
- 14 implementation of funding should be set in a maximum time span
- 15 of 10 years.
- 16 Section 4: This law shall go into effect in the beginning of Fiscal
- 17 Year of 2025.
- 18 Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 19 declared null and void.
