- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: A national voter-registration program will be created to
- 3 make Election Day a federal holiday. Partisan gerrymandering
- 4 will be banned, replaced with non-partisan commissions to draw
- 5 electoral districts. For coming elections, presidential and
- 6 vice-presidential candidates will need to have their past 15
- 7 years of income tax return records approved.
- 8 Section 2: A. On Election Day, schools will be closed, as well as
- 9 offices. Restaurants and shops may remain open, however, all
- 10 employees will get paid \$15 for that hour off only. B.
- 11 Electoral districts will be drawn by a nonpartisan committee.
- 12 Further inspection will be made upon those districts to check
- 13 for biases. C. Gerrymandering shall be defined as a way to
- 14 achieve a result by manipulating the boundaries of an electoral
- 15 constituency.
- 16 Section 3: The Secretary of State's Election Divisions shall o
- 17 versee the implementation of this bill.
- 18 Section 4: This legislation shall take effect upon passage.
- 19 Section 5: All laws in con?ict with this legislation are hereby d
- 20 eclared null and void.

A Resolution to Formally Declare the Chinese Humanitarian Crisis as Genocide

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 WHEREAS, 1: The Chinese government is holding 1-3 million Uighur
- 3 Muslims in at least 85 "re-education" camps.
- 4 WHEREAS, 2: These internment camps have been criticized for human
- 5 rights abuses, including abuse, rape, and torture.
- 6 WHEREAS, 3: According to the United Nation's Convention of the C
- 7 rime of Genocide, genocide means any of the following acts
- 8 committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a
- 9 national, ethnical, racial or religious group, as such: (1)
- 10 Killing members of the group; (2) Causing serious bodily or
- 11 mental harm to members of the group; (3) Deliberately
- 12 inflicting on the group conditions of life calculated to bring
- about its physical destruction in whole or in part; (4)
- 14 Imposing measures intended to prevent births within the
- 15 group; (5) Forcibly transferring children of the group to
- 16 another group.
- 17 WHEREAS, 4: These actions have all, to some degree, been committed
- 18 by the Chinese government, be it
- 19 WHEREAS, 5: RESOLVED, by the Congress here assembled that The
- 20 United States takes a vocal standpoint in denigrating the
- 21 atrocities committed by the Chinese government in Xinjiang and
- 22 say outright that Bejing is committing genocide against the
- 23 Uighur Population.
- 24 WHEREAS, 6: BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, This Congress will urge
- 25 the UN to take action against China for their atrocities
- 26 committed and force China to take responsibility to a degree
- 27 which the UN collectively sees fit.

A Bill to Establish a No-Fly Zone over Ukraine to Halt Direct Military Engagement

- 2 Section 1: The United States Federal Government declares an
- 3 enforced no-fly zone for armed military craft over the
- 4 territory of the nation-state Ukraine.
- 5 Section 2: A designated no-fly zone bans certain aircraft from
- 6 flying over an established area.
- 7 Section 3: Per Article 5, NATO will enforce with full usage of
- 8 necessary military force, tactics, and resources.
- 9 Section 4: Two weeks from passage of this bill enforcement of the
- 10 no-fly zone will begin.
- 11 Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 12 declared null and void.
