7		though they do enroll US citizens. There be it
8	RESOLVED,	That Tribal colleges in the United States should be given extra support from
9		State and Local education budget proportionate to the number of
10		Indigenous citizens they enroll. and
11	FURTHER RES	OLVED, the Congress will give these colleges priority in the allocation of
12		specific grants to college students to afford tuition.

8		strategic interests and stability, THEREFORE BE IT
9	RESOLVED,	that the United States supports Egypt in its dispute with Ethiopia over the
10		Nile River Dam, and
11	1 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the United States mediates a treaty between Egypt, Sudan, and	
12		Ethiopia regarding water access along the Nile River.

A Bill to Stop Offering Military Contracts with Civilian Technology Companies

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The US military shall be barred from initiating contracts with large tech
2		companies that also provide consumer products.
3	SECTION 2.	Large tech companies shall be defined as large private enterprises—such as
4		Facebook, Google, and Amazon—which primarily develop technologies
5		through the internet or through technology information sciences. This also
6		includes companies which provide expertise in data science, cloud
7		computing, and cybersecurity.
8	SECTION 3.	The Departments of Commerce and Defense shall enforce this legislation.
9	SECTION 4.	This legislation will go into effect in FY 2022
10	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

7	SECTION 3.	This bill shall be enforced by the Department of State in coalition with the
8		Department of Defense.
	SECTION 4.	This bill will go into effect January 1st, 2022.
	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
