A Bill to Ban the Use of Slavery Chocolate

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: The United States shall ban the importation of chocolate
- 3 and cocoa that uses child or slave labor in its production.
- 4 Section 2: Chocolate/cocoa producers must comply with either the
- 5 Fairtrade Standard for Small Producer Organizations or the
- 6 Fairtrade Standard for Contract Production (only for the
- 7 Pacific region) and the Fairtrade Standard for Cocoa.
- 8 Section 3: The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) shall
- 9 oversee the enforcement of the bill by applying Fairtrade
- 10 International standards to the companies who wish to import
- 11 chocolate into the US.
- 12 Section 4: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2024.
- 13 Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
- 14 shall hereby be declared null and void.
- 15 Introduced for Congressional Debate by NOF.

A Resolution to Condemn Antifa

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 WHEREAS, 1: Antifa's actions have repeatedly been focused on
- 3 disrupting and antagonizing political discourse; and
- 4 WHEREAS, 2: Antifa has grown in recent years, both in terms of size
- 5 and influence; and
- 6 WHEREAS, 3: Antifa actions have damaged public and private
- 7 property; and injured those who are politically opposed to
- 8 Antifa; and engages in domestic terrorism; now, therefore, be
- 9 it
- 10 WHEREAS, 4: Resolved, that the Congress here assembled publicly
- 11 condemn the actions of Antifa.
- 12 Introduced for Congressional Debate by CMSF.

A Bill to Ban Supreme Court Leaking

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: This federal law will explicitly prohibit someone with
- 3 legal access to a draft Supreme Court opinion from leaking that
- 4 document.
- 5 Section 2: A draft Supreme Court opinion shall be defined as any
- 6 internal memo, document, e-mail, or other writing that includes
- 7 details about an ongoing Supreme Court case, which has not been
- 8 publicly released. A person with legal access is usually
- 9 considered to be a justice or clerk of the Supreme Court.
- 10 Section 3: The Marshal of the Supreme Court will oversee the
- 11 enforcement of the bill. They will ensure that any leaks are
- 12 investigated and brought to trial.
- 13 Section 4: Implementation will occur immediately upon passage.
- 14 Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
- 15 shall hereby be declared null and void.
- 16 Introduced for Congressional Debate by NOF.

A Federal Ban Against Ballot Harvesting

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: All ballots cast for federal elections must be cast
- 3 directly by the voter.
- 4 Section 2: Voters may not allow family members, friends, designees,
- 5 mules, or any other person to deliver their ballot to a polling
- 6 place or to a USPS delivery portal. Special provisions can be
- 7 made to allow a polling official to travel to voters who are
- 8 unable to cast their own ballots.
- 9 Section 3: The Federal Election Commission will oversee the
- 10 enforcement of the bill.
- 11 Section 4: This bill shall go into effect January 1st, 2023.
- 12 Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
- 13 shall hereby be declared null and void.
- 14 Introduced for Congressional Debate by CMSF.

A Bill to Require Postal Carriers to Wear Body Cameras

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: All United States Postal Service (USPS) delivery workers
- 3 shall be required to wear a body camera while on duty.
- 4 Section 2: USPS delivery workers are defined as those who leave the
- 5 USPS branch to make deliveries. Such workers are permitted to
- 6 turn off the camera during breaks.
- 7 Section 3: The United States Postal Service will oversee the
- 8 enforcement of the bill. The USPS will conduct regular reviews
- 9 of employees to ensure that safety and efficiency guidelines
- 10 are being met.
- 11 Section 4: This legislation will go into effect January 1, 2023.
- 12 Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
- 13 shall hereby be declared null and void.
- 14 Introduced for Congressional Debate by NOF.

A Bill to Abolish the US Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS)

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 Section 1: The US Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS) will
- 3 be abolished.
- 4 Section 2: Immigrants to the United States will only be denied
- 5 entry if the Department of Homeland Security deems them a
- 6 security threat to the United States.
- 7 Section 3: The Department of Homeland Security will oversee the
- 8 enforcement of the bill.
- 9 Section 4: Implementation will occur immediately upon passage.
- 10 Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
- 11 shall hereby be declared null and void.
