A Bill to Use eBooks

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. Section 1 Upon passage of this bill, all partially- and
3. fully-federally-funded schools shall be required to use eBooks as
4. textbooks instead of printed books.
5. Section 2 An eBook is a book in electronic form that can be read on
6. a computer or handheld device rather than in print.
7. Section 3 The Department of Education shall oversee the enforcement
8. of this bill.
9. Section 4 This bill shall go into effect in the 2024-2025 school
10. year.
11. Section 5 All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
12. shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Styrofoam Food Containers

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. Section 1 The use of styrofoam by restaurants and other providers
3. of prepared meals for packaging and/or serving food and/or
4. beverages is hereby banned.
5. Section 2 Any establishment found to be in violation of this
6. legislation shall be fined \$100 for each violation. Should the
7. total amount fined to a single establishment ever exceed \$10,000,
8. that establishment shall lose its license(s) to sell food and/or
9. beverages.
10. Section 3 This legislation shall be overseen by the Food and Drug
11. Administration.
12. Section 4 This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2024.
13. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.

A Resolution to Prioritize Mars Colonization

3. called into question, and
4. WHEREAS, colonization on other planets would enable humans to avoid

6. WHEREAS, space exploration is expensive, but is the ultimate goal
7. of humanity, and
8. WHEREAS, further space exploration depends on the ability of humans
9. to colonize a nearby planet, therefore be it
10. RESOLVED, that humans should prioritize the colonization of Mars.

Privatization of the Postal Service

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. Section 1 The United States Postal Service shall be privatized, and
3. would cut all business ties to the United States Federal

5. Section 2 Privatization of the USPS would require that the
6. organization no longer be owned and operated by the government.
7. Section 3 The Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee
8. will ensure that the privatization is done in accordance with
9. standing laws. The USPS will issue stocks that would be
10. available for purchase by the general public.
11. Section 4 This bill shall go into effect on January 1st, 2024
12. Section 5 All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
13. shall hereby be declared null and void.

7. violent nature of video gaming; therefore be it
8. RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled condemn violent video
9. games.
