2. **Section 1** The Child Nutrition Act of 1966 shall be ammended to establish

3. waiver authority to address certain emergencies, disasters, and supply

4. chain disruptions.

5. **Section 2** The term `emergency' means a period during which there exists a

6. public health emergency declared by the Secretary of Health and Human

7. Services under section 319 of the Public Health Service Act or a

8. presidentially declared major emergency or disaster as defined under

9. section 102 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency

10. Assistance Act. The term `supply chain disruption' means a shortage of

11. supplemental foods that impedes the redemption of food instruments, as

12. determined by the Secretary of Agriculture.

13. **Section 3** The U.S. Department of Agriculture will oversee the enforcement of

14. the bill.

15. **Section 4** This bill shall go into effect immediately upon passage.

16. **Section 5** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall

17. hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Consumer Fuel Price Gouging

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** This bill prohibits any person from selling, during a proclaimed

3. energy emergency, a consumer fuel at a price that (1) is unconscionably

4. excessive, and (2) indicates that the seller is exploiting the emergency to

5. increase prices unreasonably. Civil penalties collected by the commission

6. through such enforcement must be used to provide assistance under the Low

7. Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

8. **Section 2** Emergencies shall be defined by The President of the United States.

9. The President may issue a proclamation of such an emergency that specifies

10. the consumer fuel and geographic area covered and how long the

11. proclamation applies.

12. **Section 3** The Federal Trade Commission and state attorneys general shall

13. oversee the enforcement of this bill.

14. **Section 4** This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage.

15. **Section 5** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall

16. hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Require States to Test Water for Forever Chemicals

2. **Section 1** Upon passage of this bill, each state shall be required to conduct

3. water table testing for forever chemicals. The results of these tests

4. shall be made public immediately.

5. **Section 2** Forever chemicals are polyfluoroalkyl substances that make certain

6. products nonstick or stain resistant. These chemicals are often thought to

7. be dangerous.

8. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will oversee the

9. enforcement of the bill.

10. **Section 4** This bill shall go into effect November 1st, 2022.

11. **Section 5** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall

12. hereby be declared null and void.
