A Bill to Close the Fragrance Loophole

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
 Section 1 Any cosmetic brand owner shall make public the following
 information: (1) any fragrance or flavor ingredient present in
 cosmetics at a concentration that equals or exceeds .01 percent;
 (2) any chemical used in a fragrance or flavor ingredient present
 in such cosmetics, regardless of percentage, that are identified
 as likely to be carcinogenic to humans or any persistent,
 bioaccumulative, and toxic Priority Chemicals identified by the
 Environmental Protection Agency's National Waste Minimization
 Program as of February 22, 2016.
 Section 2 The term 'flavor ingredient' means any intentionally

12. added substance or complex mixture of aroma chemicals or
13. natural essential oils for which the purpose is to impart a
14. flavor or taste, or to counteract a flavor or taste. The term
15. 'fragrance ingredient' means any intentionally added substance
16. or complex mixture of aroma chemicals, natural essential oils,
17. and other functional ingredient or ingredients for which the
18. purpose is to impart an odor or scent, or to counteract an odor.
19. Section 3 The Food and Drug Administration shall oversee the
20. enforcement of this law.

Section 4 This law shall go into effect January 1, 2024.
 Section 5 All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy
 shall hereby be declared null and void.
