We are pleased to announce our third annual Golden Cowboy Swing. We invite the forensics community to our cozy little campus, nestled in the foothills of the San Raphael Mountains. We are lucky enough to again co-host our tournament with California State University, Los Angeles (CSULA), veiled in the mysterious ghost-town of downtown Los Angeles. So, come on down and join us for the festivities!

ACTIVITIES/GRUB:

The first half of the competition is as famous as Wild Bill Hickok for havin' all sorts of fun an' games. It's always a surprise what the cowboys and cowgals will come up with, but more'n likely you'll have a scavenger hunt, a piñata or two, and plenty of things to keep yerself occupied. Plus, we'll have our saloon girls teach y'all how to line dance. More importantly, we'll have plenty of food, so you can enjoy the festivities instead of leavin'. But, if what we provide ain't to yer likin', there's food to be had right across the street at some local eateries.

ACCOMODATIONS:

The swing tournament will be held Feb. 11-13, 2011. The first half of the swing will be held at Glendale Community College (GCC) on Friday and Saturday, and the second part will take place on Sunday at CSULA. The campuses are located about ten miles away from one another, and many hotels provide easy access to both. We have secured a block of rooms at the Glendale Hilton at a rate of \$109 per night. ENTRIES:

We will again offer NFA-LD, with the prelims and finals to be held on Friday, Feb. 11th. Saturday and Sunday will follow traditional IE swing schedules, with two prelims and finals for each pattern. Triple entries are allowed in Open, double entries allowed in Novice. Open ADS will have THREE prelim rounds on Saturday (see below for more information).

DIVISIONS:

We will provide a Novice Division in all events with at least 10 Novice contestants. Otherwise, we will award a "Top Novice" speaker at the awards ceremony. Coaches must identify novices at the time of entry. Novice = any student who has attended 3 or fewer tournaments.

AWARDS:

Awards will be provided for all finalists, including sweepstakes for the top three colleges and a top community college award. We plan to have both a varsity and junior varsity division in LD debate and will offer a novice division in all events if entries warrant.

Congratulations to last year's ADS winner, Sean Connor. We have named the award after Connor (who also won it the previous year), therefore, it is now called the Connor-Connor Award. Let your students know that this year's winner will add his/her name to the award, to make it the Connor-Connor-Blank ADS Award in 2011. Please assist us in supporting this tradition by encouraging your students to showcase AFA qualified ADS-es at the Saturday portion of the swing for a chance to secure their name in Golden Cowboy lore. As a result of this special feature, ADS will have 3 prelim rounds on Saturday, each round will have two judges. Additionally, the final round of ADS will have five judges and will be videotaped (finalist teams will have a free DVD mailed shortly after the competition).
