- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2. Section 1 Motorcycles shall not exceed 85 decibels of noise when
- 3. driven through residential areas.
- 4. Section 2 For the purposes of this bill: A. Residential areas
- 5. include neighborhoods where people live, as designated by local
- 6. governments. B. Decibels are a measurement of sound; 85 decibels
- 7. is about as loud as a leaf blower.
- 8. Section 3 Local police departments will be in charge of
- 9. enforcement. Riders who break the rule will be fined \$200.
- 10. Section 4 This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
- 11. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 12. declared null and void.

- 6. computer graphics, are available; now, therefore, be it
- 7. RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled support a ban on using
- 8. live wild animals in television advertisements.

A Bill to Limit the Use of Bright Billboards at Night

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2. Section 1 Electronic billboards may not display bright lights
- 3. between the hours of 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM.
- 4. Section 2 For the purposes of this bill: A. Electronic billboards
- 5. are large digital signs used for advertising that change images
- 6. or videos using screens. B. Bright lights include any display
- 7. brighter than 300 nits, as measured by the Department of
- 8. Transportation.
- 9. Section 3 The Department of Transportation will enforce this rule.
- 10. Billboards found to violate the brightness limits will be fined
- 11. \$1,000 per day.
- 12. Section 4 This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
- 13. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 14. declared null and void.
