

A Resolution to Phase Out Private Ownership of Military-Grade Weapons

1. **WHEREAS**, Civilian ownership of military-grade weapons, such as
2. automatic rifles and high-capacity magazines, has contributed to
3. mass shootings and increased public safety risks; and
4. **WHEREAS**, The presence of such weapons in civilian hands challenges
5. law enforcement's ability to maintain public order; and
6. **WHEREAS**, The Second Amendment guarantees the right to bear arms,
7. but reasonable regulation has been upheld as constitutional; now,
8. therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support a gradual
10. phase-out of private civilian ownership of military-grade
11. weapons, with government buy-back programs to reduce public
12. stockpiles.

A Resolution to Limit the Sale of Ultra-Processed Foods in Schools

1. **WHEREAS**, Ultra-processed foods high in sugar, salt, and chemical
2. additives contribute to rising rates of childhood obesity and
3. diabetes; and
4. **WHEREAS**, These foods are often cheaper than healthier options,
5. making them more common in schools; and
6. **WHEREAS**, Limiting ultra-processed foods could encourage healthier
7. eating habits for students; now, therefore, be it
8. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support restrictions on
9. the sale of ultra-processed foods in school cafeterias and
10. vending machines.

A Bill to Require Noise Limits on Motorcycles in Neighborhoods

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Motorcycles shall not exceed 85 decibels of noise when
3. driven through residential areas.
4. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill: A. Residential areas
5. include neighborhoods where people live, as designated by local
6. governments. B. Decibels are a measurement of sound; 85 decibels
7. is about as loud as a leaf blower.
8. **Section 3** Local police departments will be in charge of
9. enforcement. Riders who break the rule will be fined \$200.
10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.
