

## A Bill to Recognize Water Access as a Human Right

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Access to safe and affordable drinking water shall be  
3. recognized as a legal right for all people within the United  
4. States.

5. **Section 2** Water utilities may not shut off service to households  
6. due to nonpayment if doing so would leave residents without  
7. access to safe drinking water.

8. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will enforce  
9. this law and work with state agencies to provide emergency  
10. funding for water access.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

12. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
13. declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Regulate Corporate Influence in U.S. Elections

1. **WHEREAS**, The rise of corporate political spending has significantly
2. increased since the Citizens United v. FEC decision; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Unlimited corporate contributions may drown out the voices
4. of ordinary citizens; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Allowing corporations to shape elections risks undermining
6. public trust in democracy; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Other democracies have stricter limits on corporate
8. election spending; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support legislation to
10. limit corporate contributions to political campaigns and
11. political action committees (PACs).

## A Bill to Abolish the Electoral College

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The Electoral College system shall be abolished, and the

3. President of the United States shall be elected by direct

4. national popular vote.

5. **Section 2** A direct national popular vote shall mean that the

6. candidate with the greatest number of individual votes nationwide

7. shall become President.

8. **Section 3** The Federal Election Commission (FEC) shall oversee the

9. implementation of this system, ensuring accurate national vote

10. counting and certification.

11. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2028,

12. following a constitutional amendment process.

13. **Section 5** All laws and constitutional provisions in conflict with

14. this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
