

A Bill to Prohibit the Use of Artificial Intelligence in Judicial Sentencing

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** No court in the United States shall use artificial
3. intelligence systems to determine or recommend sentencing
4. outcomes for criminal cases.

5. **Section 2** Artificial intelligence systems include any algorithmic
6. software designed to predict recidivism or recommend sentencing
7. ranges based on data analysis.

8. **Section 3** The Department of Justice (DOJ) will enforce this law by
9. auditing state and federal courts to ensure compliance. Any
10. jurisdiction found using AI-based sentencing tools will lose
11. access to certain federal grants.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.

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**A Resolution to Limit Private Ownership of
Orbital Satellites**

1. **WHEREAS**, Private corporations now own the majority of operational
2. satellites in Earth's orbit; and
3. **WHEREAS**, These satellites pose risks of collision, space debris,
4. and interference with astronomy and national security operations;
5. and
6. **WHEREAS**, International space treaties provide limited guidance on
7. corporate ownership and accountability; and
8. **WHEREAS**, The rapid commercialization of space has outpaced
9. regulatory capacity; now, therefore, be it
10. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled call for federal
11. legislation and international cooperation to limit private
12. satellite ownership and require companies to obtain government
13. authorization for all orbital launches.

A Bill to End Agricultural Subsidies for Fossil Fuel-Derived Fertilizers

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) shall
3. end all federal subsidies for the production and purchase of
4. nitrogen-based fertilizers derived from fossil fuels.

5. **Section 2** Fossil fuel-derived fertilizers refer to synthetic
6. fertilizers produced using natural gas or petroleum-based
7. processes.

8. **Section 3** The USDA and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
9. will jointly oversee enforcement. Farmers transitioning to
10. organic or renewable fertilizer alternatives will receive tax
11. credits during the first five years of implementation.

12. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2028.

13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
14. declared null and void.
