A Bill to Require Transparency in Online Subscription Cancellations

- 4. signed up.
- 5. Section 2 Subscription services include streaming platforms, gaming
- 6. services, fitness apps, and digital news outlets that charge
- 7. recurring fees.
- 8. Section 3 The Federal Trade Commission will enforce this law and
- 9. may fine companies \$5,000 per user affected by noncompliant
- 10. cancellation practices.
- 11. Section 4 This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
- 12. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 13. declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Food Packaging with Cartoon Characters

- 1. WHEREAS, Food packaging that uses cartoon characters to advertise
- 2. products high in sugar, salt, or fat shall be prohibited.
- 3. WHEREAS, This restriction applies to cereals, snacks, candy, and
- 4. drinks marketed primarily to children.
- 5. WHEREAS, The Federal Trade Commission will enforce this law.
- 6. Companies that violate the ban will be fined \$10,000 per product.
- 7. WHEREAS, This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.
- 8. RESOLVED, All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 9. declared null and void.
