

A Bill to Require Standardized Disclosures in Medicare Advantage Marketing to Enhance Transparency and Informed Consent

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) shall
3. require all Medicare Advantage plans to include a standardized,
4. plain-language disclosure in all marketing materials and
5. enrollment communications explaining material limitations on
6. access to care.

7. **Section 2** (A) "Medicare Advantage Plan" means a private insurance
8. plan approved by Medicare that replaces Original Medicare for
9. Part A and Part B coverage, and may include additional benefits,
10. under Medicare Part C. (B) "Marketing Material" means any
11. advertisement, solicitation, enrollment communication, or
12. promotional content intended to encourage enrollment in a
13. Medicare Advantage plan. (C) "Standardized Disclosure" means a
14. uniform notice developed by CMS that clearly explains provider
15. network limitations and prior authorization requirements.

16. **Section 3** CMS shall oversee enforcement of this policy and may
17. conduct audits, require corrective action, and impose civil
18. monetary penalties on Medicare Advantage organizations that fail
19. to comply with disclosure requirements.

20. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect in FY 2027.

21. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
22. declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit Facial Recognition in Apartment Buildings

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** Apartment buildings may not require tenants to use facial
3. recognition technology as a condition for entry or residency.

4. **Section 2** Facial recognition technology refers to any system that
5. scans or stores facial images to identify individuals for access
6. or security purposes.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Housing and Urban Development will
8. enforce this law. Property owners who violate this requirement
9. will be fined \$25,000 per violation.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.
