

**A Bill to Ban Plastic Six-Pack Rings**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Plastic six-pack rings used to hold soda or beer cans
3. together shall be banned in the United States.
4. **Section 2** Only biodegradable or recyclable alternatives may be used
5. to package multi-can beverages.
6. **Section 3** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will enforce
7. this law. Companies that break the rule will be fined \$2,000 per
8. violation.
9. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
10. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
11. declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Limit Outdoor Holiday Lights

1. **WHEREAS**, Outdoor holiday light displays use large amounts of
2. electricity and increase energy costs; and
3. **WHEREAS**, Bright light displays can cause light pollution that
4. disrupts wildlife and sleep patterns for neighbors; and
5. **WHEREAS**, Families should still be allowed to celebrate holidays,
6. but in ways that are more sustainable; now, therefore, be it
7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourage limits on the
8. amount of electricity and time outdoor holiday lights may be used.

## A Bill to Require Safety Helmets for Electric Scooter Riders

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All riders of electric scooters in the United States must  
3. wear safety helmets.

4. **Section 2** Electric scooters are defined as small two-wheeled  
5. vehicles powered by an electric motor, often used for  
6. short-distance travel in cities.

7. **Section 3** Local police departments will enforce this law. Riders  
8. found without helmets will be fined \$50.

9. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

10. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
11. declared null and void.
