

A Bill to Ban Loud Ice Cream Truck Music

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Ice cream trucks shall not play music louder than 65 decibels while driving through residential neighborhoods.
4. **Section 2** This rule applies between the hours of 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM.
5. **Section 3** Local governments will enforce this law. Ice cream truck operators who violate the noise limit will be fined \$100 per offense.
8. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
9. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

6. unhealthy; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Some park visitors believe feeding animals helps them
8. survive; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled encourage limits on
10. feeding wildlife in public city parks.

A Bill to Limit Self-Checkout Lanes in Grocery Stores

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** Grocery stores with more than ten checkout lanes must
3. keep at least half of their lanes staffed by human cashiers
4. during all open hours.
5. **Section 2** This requirement applies to grocery stores larger than
6. 20,000 square feet.
7. **Section 3** The Department of Commerce will enforce this law. Stores
8. that do not meet the staffing requirement will be fined \$1,000
9. per day.
10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.
