

A Bill to Establish a Federal Digital Literacy Curriculum in All Public Schools

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The federal government shall establish a National Digital
3. Literacy Curriculum to be implemented in all public middle
4. schools in the United States, providing students with the skills
5. to critically evaluate online information, identify
6. misinformation, protect their personal data, and navigate digital
7. spaces safely and responsibly.

8. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill, "digital literacy" shall
9. mean the ability to access, evaluate, create, and communicate
10. information using digital technologies, including but not
11. limited to skills in source evaluation, recognition of
12. misinformation and algorithmic bias, data privacy practices, and
13. responsible online conduct.

14. **Section 3** The National Digital Literacy Curriculum shall be funded
15. at no less than five hundred million dollars annually,
16. appropriated by Congress and administered by the Department of
17. Education, which shall develop the curriculum in consultation
18. with technology experts, classroom educators, civil society
19. organizations, and student representatives.

20. **Section 4** The Department of Education shall make the completed
21. curriculum available to all public middle schools at no cost
22. within eighteen months of this bill's passage, along with
23. accompanying teacher training materials and professional
24. development resources. All public schools in the United States
25. shall integrate digital literacy instruction into existing
26. courses or offer it as a standalone subject for no fewer than
27. one full semester.

28. **Section 5** The Department of Education shall establish a compliance

30. annual reports documenting how digital literacy instruction is
31. being delivered, which grade levels are being served, and how
32. many students are completing the required instruction each year.
33. Schools that fail to demonstrate compliance within one
34. additional year shall be subject to a reduction in federal
35. education funding at the discretion of the Department of
36. Education.

37. **Section 6** The Department of Education shall review and update the
38. National Digital Literacy Curriculum every three years to ensure
39. its content remains current with changes in technology, digital
40. culture, and emerging threats to online safety and information
41. integrity.

42. **Section 7** This bill shall take effect one year following its
43. passage. All laws and regulations in conflict with this bill are
44. hereby declared null and void.

2026 NOF Emerald/Walnut Invite (HS) Docket -- Federal Cash Bail Reform and Pretrial Assessment Act

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The federal government shall eliminate the use of cash
3. bail in all federal criminal proceedings and replace it with a
4. standardized AI-assisted pretrial risk assessment system that
5. evaluates each defendant's flight risk and danger to the
6. community without consideration of their financial resources or
7. ability to pay.

8. **Section 2** For the purposes of this bill, the AI-assisted risk
9. assessment tool shall analyze factors including criminal history,
10. nature of the alleged offense, community ties, and prior court
11. appearance record. The use of race, income, zip code, or other
12. socioeconomic proxies as inputs shall be expressly prohibited.
13. The tool shall be developed in collaboration with criminal
14. justice experts, artificial intelligence researchers, and civil
15. liberties organizations, and shall undergo rigorous bias
16. auditing before deployment.

17. **Section 3** The Department of Justice shall oversee development and
18. deployment of the system, funded at no less than three hundred
19. million dollars for an initial one-year implementation period,
20. and shall distribute model frameworks and funding incentives to
21. states that adopt compatible reforms.

22. **Section 4** A trained pretrial services officer shall present the
23. algorithm's recommendation to the presiding judge, who retains
24. full authority to accept, modify, or override the assessment.
25. Nothing in this bill shall prevent a judge from ordering
26. detention where a defendant poses a serious and demonstrated
27. risk to public safety.

28. **Section 5** The Department of Justice shall publish annual public

30. override rates, and shall commission an independent review of
31. the assessment tool every three years.
32. **Section 6** This bill shall take effect upon its passage. All
33. federal laws and regulations in conflict with this bill are
34. hereby declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Urge the United States to
Develop a Comprehensive Strategy for Addressing
Antibiotic Resistance**

1. **WHEREAS**, Antibiotic-resistant bacteria – sometimes called
2. "superbugs" – are estimated by the World Health Organization to
3. be among the most significant threats to global public health in
4. the coming decades, already causing hundreds of thousands of
5. deaths annually worldwide and projected to cause millions more if
6. left unchecked; and
7. **WHEREAS**, The overuse and misuse of antibiotics in human medicine
8. and industrial agriculture has accelerated the development of
9. resistant bacterial strains, while the pipeline for new
10. antibiotic drugs has slowed dramatically due to insufficient
11. financial incentives for pharmaceutical research and
12. development; and
13. **WHEREAS**, The United States currently lacks a fully funded and
14. coordinated national strategy to address antibiotic resistance
15. across the healthcare, agricultural, and pharmaceutical sectors,
16. leaving the country poorly prepared for the public health
17. consequences of a post-antibiotic world; now, therefore, be it
18. **RESOLVED**, By this Congress that the United States recognizes
19. antibiotic resistance as a critical public health emergency
20. requiring urgent and coordinated federal action, and urges the
21. executive branch to develop and fully fund a comprehensive
22. national strategy to combat antibiotic resistance; and, be it
23. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That Congress urges the Department of Health and
24. Human Services, in coordination with the Department of
25. Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration, to strengthen
26. regulations on antibiotic use in industrial agriculture, expand
27. surveillance of resistant infections, and develop meaningful
