

## A Bill to Require Digital Literacy Education in All Public Schools

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All public middle schools in the United States shall  
3. include a digital literacy course as a required part of the  
4. curriculum for all students.

5. **Section 2** Digital literacy is defined as the ability to safely and  
6. effectively use digital tools, evaluate online information for  
7. credibility, and understand basic principles of online privacy  
8. and cybersecurity.

9. **Section 3** The Department of Education will oversee implementation  
10. and provide curriculum guidelines. Schools will be incentivized  
11. to participate in digital literacy programs with an annual grant  
12. to cover the salary of one teacher for five consecutive years  
13. upon passage.

14. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

15. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
16. declared null and void.

2026 NOF Diamond/Maple Invite (HS) Docket --  
**A Bill to Cap Prices on Insulin and Essential  
Prescription Medications**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The federal government shall establish a maximum  
3. allowable retail price for insulin and any prescription  
4. medication designated as essential by the Department of Health  
5. and Human Services (HHS). The price cap shall be set at no more  
6. than 120 percent of the average international market price for  
7. each designated drug, as calculated annually by HHS.

8. **Section 2** Essential prescription medications are defined as drugs  
9. identified by HHS as critical to treating chronic or  
10. life-threatening conditions affecting a significant portion of  
11. the U.S. population, including but not limited to diabetes,  
12. heart disease, and asthma.

13. **Section 3** The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and  
14. the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) shall jointly enforce  
15. this law. Pharmaceutical manufacturers found charging above the  
16. federal cap will be subject to fines of up to \$1,000,000 per  
17. drug per month of non-compliance, with revenues directed into a  
18. Patient Assistance Fund to subsidize medication costs for  
19. uninsured individuals. Annual price transparency reports must be  
20. submitted by all manufacturers of designated drugs.

21. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027,  
22. following a one-year transition period during which  
23. manufacturers may petition HHS for price cap adjustments.

24. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
25. declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Support Federal Protections for Wetland Ecosystems

1. **WHEREAS**, Wetlands, including marshes, swamps, bogs, and coastal
2. estuaries, provide critical ecological services including flood
3. mitigation, water filtration, carbon sequestration, and habitat
4. for hundreds of threatened and endangered species; and
5. **WHEREAS**, The United States has lost more than half of its original
6. wetland coverage since the colonial era, with ongoing losses
7. driven by agricultural expansion, urban development, and
8. industrial activity; and
9. **WHEREAS**, The Supreme Court's 2023 decision in Sackett v. EPA
10. significantly narrowed the scope of federal wetland protections
11. under the Clean Water Act, removing safeguards for millions of
12. acres of previously protected wetlands; and
13. **WHEREAS**, The economic value of services provided by healthy
14. wetland ecosystems – including storm surge protection, water
15. purification, and fisheries support – is estimated at hundreds
16. of billions of dollars annually, yet these services are not
17. captured in existing market frameworks; and
18. **WHEREAS**, Restoring and protecting wetlands is among the most
19. cost-effective natural strategies available for addressing
20. climate change, biodiversity loss, and water security
21. simultaneously; now, therefore, be it
22. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support the passage of
23. comprehensive federal wetlands protection legislation that
24. restores and expands the scope of Clean Water Act protections,
25. establishes a \$2 billion annual restoration fund administered by
26. the Environmental Protection Agency and the Army Corps of
27. Engineers, and creates enforceable no-net-loss standards
28. requiring that any approved development impacting wetlands be
