

A Resolution to End the Use of Facial Recognition in Public Schools

1. **WHEREAS**, Some public schools have installed facial recognition
2. cameras for security purposes; and
3. **WHEREAS**, These systems can misidentify students and staff,
4. especially people of color and those with disabilities; and
5. **WHEREAS**, The use of facial recognition raises major concerns about
6. privacy and data protection for minors; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Schools can use safer and less invasive security measures,
8. such as ID cards or on-site staff monitoring; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled support a ban on the use
10. of facial recognition technology in all public schools in the
11. United States.

A Bill to Phase Out Gas-Powered School Buses

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All new school buses purchased with federal funding must
3. be electric by the year 2030.

4. **Section 2** Electric buses are defined as buses powered entirely by
5. rechargeable electric batteries rather than gasoline or diesel
6. fuel.

7. **Section 3** The Department of Transportation will oversee this
8. transition and provide grants to school districts for electric
9. bus purchases and charging infrastructure.

10. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

11. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
12. declared null and void.
