A Bill to Require Warning Labels on Video Games with Online Chat

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2. Section 1 All video games that include online chat features must
- 3. have a visible warning label informing players that online
- 4. interactions may expose them to bullying or inappropriate content.
- 5. Section 2 The Entertainment Software Rating Board (ESRB) will
- 6. ensure that all affected games display the warning on the box,
- 7. startup screen, or download page.
- 8. Section 3 The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will enforce this law.
- 9. Game publishers who fail to display proper warnings will be fined
- 10. \$10,000 per title.
- 11. Section 4 This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
- 12. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 13. declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit the Sale of Consumer Data

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2. Section 1 Companies in the United States shall be prohibited from
- 3. selling or transferring personal consumer data to third parties
- 4. without explicit consent from the consumer.
- 5. Section 2 Personal consumer data includes names, locations,
- 6. browsing history, purchasing records, and any information that
- 7. can identify an individual.
- 8. Section 3 The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will enforce this law.
- 9. Companies that violate it will face fines of up to \$100,000 per
- 10. incident.
- 11. Section 4 This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.
- 12. Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 13. declared null and void.

A Resolution to Limit Private Ownership of Orbital Satellites

- 1. WHEREAS, Private corporations now own the majority of operational
- 2. satellites in Earth's orbit; and
- 3. WHEREAS, These satellites pose risks of collision, space debris,
- 4. and interference with astronomy and national security operations;

- 6. WHEREAS, International space treaties provide limited guidance on
- 7. corporate ownership and accountability; and
- 8. WHEREAS, The rapid commercialization of space has outpaced
- 9. regulatory capacity; now, therefore, be it
- 10. RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled call for federal
- 11. legislation and international cooperation to limit private
- 12. satellite ownership and require companies to obtain government
- 13. authorization for all orbital launches.
