## A Bill to Improve Nutritional Standards in Public School Cafeterias

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** All public school cafeterias receiving federal funding  
3. shall serve meals that meet updated nutritional guidelines,  
4. including daily servings of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains.

5. **Section 2** "School cafeteria" means any food service program  
6. operating within a federally funded public school. "Nutritional  
7. guidelines" means the standards published by the United States  
8. Department of Agriculture (USDA) in line with the 2025-2030  
9. Dietary Guidelines for Americans.

10. **Section 3** The United States Department of Agriculture shall  
11. enforce this legislation. The USDA shall update school meal  
12. standards within 120 days of passage. Schools failing to comply  
13. shall lose federal meal subsidies. A sum of \$500 million shall  
14. be appropriated to the USDA for the first fiscal year to assist  
15. schools in meeting these standards.

16. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2027.

17. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation shall hereby  
18. be declared null and void.

# 2026 Olive Tree International Championship

## A Bill to Modernize the National Electric Grid Against Extreme Weather

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2. **Section 1** The United States shall undertake a national program to  
3. upgrade and harden the electric transmission and distribution  
4. grid in order to reduce power outages caused by extreme weather  
5. events.

6. **Section 2** "Hardening" shall be defined as physical and  
7. technological improvements, including burying power lines,  
8. upgrading transformers, and installing smart-grid monitoring  
9. systems. "Extreme weather event" shall be defined as a hurricane,  
10. wildfire, ice storm, heat wave, or flood designated as a federal  
11. emergency.

12. **Section 3** The Department of Energy (DOE) shall oversee the  
13. implementation of this legislation, and shall prioritize funding  
14. for regions with the highest frequency of weather-related  
15. outages and for low-income communities. A sum of \$20 billion  
16. shall be appropriated over a four-year period, disbursed as  
17. matching grants to state utilities and regional grid operators.  
18. Recipients shall submit progress reports to the DOE every twelve  
19. months; failure to meet agreed milestones shall result in  
20. suspension of remaining funds.

21. **Section 4** This legislation will take effect 90 days after passage,  
22. with all appropriated funds to be obligated by December 31,  
23. 2031. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
24. declared null and void.
