Dear Forensics Colleagues:

Pacific University is pleased to invite you to the annual Hap Hingston Forensics Invitational to be held on **January 7-8, 2011**. We are again collecting **ENTRY FEES** at the time of **registration on Friday, Jan 7th**. We will accept **Cash, Check or PO's**. Please make Checks or PO's out to **Pacific University**.

There are a few changes to this year's tournament. Regarding events, we are **adding LIBIELL** (Literary Interpretation for Beginning and Intermediate English Language Learners) to our IE's. Additionally, to expedite the schedule and ensure we have enough rooms for competition, we are **imposing entry restrictions** (p. 2) and **dropping one prelim round of IE's and debate** (p. 5).

The tournament is named after A.C. "Hap" Hingston. Hap was a faculty member at Pacific University from 1942–1973 and continued serving on Pacific's Board of Trustees until 1983. He also served as chairperson of the department of communications and the director of forensics for many years. We are proud to have our tournament named after Hap Hingston.

TOURNAMENT REGISTRATION

Entry Deadline: *Tuesday, Jan. 4th, at 5:00 pm*

Additional entries or substitutions will not be accepted after this point. **When registering, please indicate non-affiliated judges (i.e. hired judges that have no ties or affiliations with your school or team).**

Drop Deadline: *Wednesday, Jan 5th, at 5:00 pm*

Fees are calculated based on entries at this time; any drops after this point will be charged full entry fees including hired judging fees. Drops following this date must be emailed to dsbroyles@pacificu.edu

DIVISIONS & RESTRICTIONS

DIVISIONS

We will offer Junior and Senior divisions for all styles of IE and Debate with the exceptions of LIBIELL (Jr only), Serious Interp (Sr only), Humorous Interp (Sr only) and CX (Sr. only). Please use the following guidelines to determine the appropriate divisions for your students:

- **Junior** – This division is open to high-school freshmen, sophomores, and first-year speakers. Students in the junior division are allowed exceptions for cases of memorization and notes.
- **Senior** – This division is open to all high-school students. All senior division events will follow auto-qual rules, including ANY divisions collapsed into the senior division. Since CX is senior division only, this event is not limited to novice topic areas.

Note: Students may be entered into different divisions of debate and individual events but only one division of individual events (e.g., if a student enters the junior division of Debate, they may enter the junior or senior division of IE's but not both).

RESTRICTIONS

Based on previous complications regarding entries, divisions and availability of rooms and judges, we are imposing the following restrictions for this year:

- **Entries** – Schools will be limited to maximums of 32 entries for Individual Events (16 entries per pattern) and 8 entries for Debate. Further restrictions may be imposed as needed.
- **Divisions** – If there are insufficient entries in **ANY** event, divisions will be collapsed into the senior division accordingly thereby adhering to senior division rules.
- **Topics** - Students identified as using cuttings or speeches that they used in previous years of competition will be dropped from the event under question per the discretion of the tournament direction. Petitions must be made exclusively to the tournament director for consideration.

*Note: If we have a surplus of rooms at the close of registration we will honor a limited number of supplemental entry requests. Decisions will be based on: 1) an even distribution of requests across schools, 2) overall team size (smaller teams getting higher priority), and 3) a first come first serve basis. We will do our best to accommodate schools as best we can. Requests must be emailed to dsbroyles@pacificu.edu by **Jan 4th** for consideration. Please prioritize your requests from most to least important.*

DEBATE

DEBATE TOPICS

Cross Examination (CX), Public Forum (PF) and Lincoln Douglas (LD) will use current topics provided by the National Forensics League. CX will use the current year while PF and LD will use the January Topics. For details, see: <http://www.osaa.org/publications/handbook/1011SPEECHHandbook.pdf>. For each round of Public Debate (PD), the debaters will be given a choice of three topics from domestic and foreign affairs within the past two months. Each team will be allowed to eliminate one of the topics. Note: topic areas are not provided prior to the tournament.

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

MULTIPLE ENTRIES

Students may **double-enter** within either pattern of individual events, except for those competing in duo and extemp. For individuals in those events, please use the following guidelines:

- Students in duo may *only single-enter* in pattern A.
- Students in extemp may *only single-enter* in pattern B.

PATTERNS

Pattern A: Impromptu, LIBIELL, Oratory, Serious Interp, Duo Interp, Radio

Pattern B: Extemp, Humorous Interp, Poetry, Expository, Prose, After Dinner Speaking

AWARDS & SWEEPSTAKES

AWARDS

We will offer awards to all finalists in IE’s and Debate. Additionally we will offer awards for:

- The top three Division I and Division II teams based on overall team entry size.
- The top team Quality Award. This is calculated by taking the total sweepstakes points divided by the total number of entries. School must have at least five entries to be eligible.
- The top three individuals in each senior style of debate
- The top three individuals earning the most IE points in senior

JUDGING & FEES

JUDGING REQUIREMENTS

Schools **MUST** provide enough judges to cover at least 80% of their entire entry. Judges will be obligated up until the time of awards, and in the case of debate, one round past when their teams are eliminated. Schools are responsible for ensuring that their judges remain available throughout the competition. Both entry restrictions and additional judging fees will be imposed for schools that do not adhere to these standards. Please use the following guidelines to determine your judging requirements:

IEs: one judge covers **six entries** – one student entered in two events equals two entries.

Debate: one judge covers **four debaters** (e.g., two entries in CX, two entries in PD, two entries in PF, four entries in LD or an equivalent combination therein)

NOTE: To ensure that **all** judges are being effectively utilized, we may request assistance from some judges with tournament operations and management.
