13. all public schools in California.

A RESOLUTION ADVOCATING THE ELIMINATION OF CIVILIANS' RIGHTS TO BEAR ARMS IN THE UNITED STATES

1. Whereas there is are a recorded 300 million firearms in the United States owned by civilians in
2. 2010,
3. Whereas, in 2008, 10,886 out of 16,272 murders that occurred in the United States were
4. committed
5. with firearms, and
6. Whereas, 20 of the nation's 22 national gun laws are not enforced, and
7. Whereas, civilians owning firearms are proven distasteful and pose a risk to the rest of the
8. society, and
9. Whereas, possessing firearms actually results in a greater risk of harm done to one's self in the
10. event of attack or robbery, and
11. Whereas, if civilians were not able to own guns there would be a decrease in crimes and
12. murders,

14. BE IT RESOLVED by the Student Congress here assembled that the federal government remove
15. civilians' rights to bear arms in the United States.

A RESOLUTION ADVOCATING MANDATORY EATING DISORDER EDUCATION IN HIGH SCHOOL HEALTH CLASSES

1. Whereas 7 out of 1000 girls and 1 out of 1000 boys have an eating disorder, and
2. Whereas eating disorders are encouraged in certain athletic sports to maintain, lose, or gain
3. weight, and
4. Whereas a woman aged 15-24 is 12 times more likely to die than her peer, and
5. Whereas eating disorders result in heart, kidney and liver failure and obesity, and
6. Whereas youths suffering from eating disorders are more likely to suffer from psychological
7. disorders including depression, substance abuse, and
8. Whereas health programs do not mandatorily have teach about eating disorders, and suicide,
9. and
10. Whereas eating disorders have a negative impact on the educational environment, and

10. Whereas Educational efforts to prevent eating disorders are of primary importance to the
11. health, well being, and academic success of the Nation's students
12. Be it resolved by the Student Congress here assembled that the federal government make
13. eating disorder education mandatory in the high school health curriculum.

A RESOLUTION TO RESTORE PUBLICLY-HELD WETLANDS IN THE US

1. Whereas, wetlands provide a nursery for life hosting plants, terrestrial animals, migrating birds,
2. fish, amphibians, reptiles and invertebrate species
3. Whereas, wetlands absorb excess nutrients, sediment, and other pollutants before they reach
4. rivers, lakes, and other water bodies, and
5. Whereas, habitat degradation has been the leading cause of extinction since the 1970s, and
6. Whereas, the wetlands are depleting at about 100 yards every 15 minutes, and
7. Whereas, in the United States, 60,000 acres of wetlands are depleted annually, and
8. Whereas, in the past 15 years alone, the continental duck breeding population fell from 45
9. million to 31 million birds, a decline of 31 percent, and
10. Whereas, At least 95 plant, 5 mammal, 22 bird, 4 reptile, 3 amphibian, and 22 fish species
11. listed as endangered or threatened depend on wetland habitats
12. for survival, and
13. Whereas 75% of wetlands in the United States are publicly owned
14. Whereas, wetlands control floods thereby preventing property damages
15. Be it resolved, by the student congress here assembled that the federal
16. government should financially support the restoration of the wetlands
