The Cerritos College Falcon Forensics squad is pleased to invite you to attend the annual Tabor-Venitsky Invitational Speech and Debate Tournament to be held on Friday and Saturday, February 17 and 18, 2012. Once again, this year we will be working in conjunction with an outstanding tab room staff to provide you with an exciting tournament.

We would also like to invite you to the Southern California LD Championships - a one day NFA-LD and Parli LD swing tournament to be held on Sunday, February 19, 2012 at Cerritos College. The Championships will offer four rounds of LD competition for your competitors in open division only. We will follow NFA rules the event breaking to appropriate elimination rounds. This tournament has no restrictions on eligibility –both 2 and 4 year students are welcome.

The Tabor-Venitsky traditionally provides a competitive preview of the PSCFA Spring Championships, CCCFA State Championship, as well as Phi Rho Pi.

We hope you will join us once again. For the Tabor-Venitsky we will offer four rounds of Parliamentary debate breaking to a bronze/gold elimination round format on Friday and three rounds of Individual Events breaking to finals on Saturday. Each day will feature a quick awards ceremony. Students may enter a maximum of two IE events per pattern.

We will offer two divisions in parliamentary debate and individual events. Please review page 4 for novice eligibility. The open division in both debate and individual events will be limited to community college students only with remaining Phi Rho Pi eligibility. There will be no coaching allowed during preparation time in parliamentary debate.

All entries must be submitted by Tuesday, February 14, 2012 at 6:00pm PST. Fees will be assessed on Wednesday at 7:00pm and no adds will be accepted after that time. We are excited about hosting the Tabor-Venitsky and the Southern California LD Championships and look forward to seeing you there.

## PATTERNS

### Friday:

Parliamentary Debate (4 prelims/2 elims)

\* Open division is limited to Community College students with Phi Rho Pi eligibility.\*  
Novice division is open to any college student meeting novice definition below.

### Saturday:

Pattern A: Persuasive, Impromptu, Sports Impromptu, POI, DI, Duo, CA\*

Pattern B: Informative, Extemporaneous\*\*, Prose, Poetry, STE\*

\* Open division only in CA, STE, and Sports Impromptu.

\*\* Students may not double enter in both Impromptu and Sports Impromptu.

### Sunday:

#### **Parli-LD**

This year the Southern California LD Championship tournament will be offering Open Parliamentary-LD debate on Sunday. This event mirrors parliamentary team debate except that it is one-on-one. The event will be offered on Sunday concurrent with NFA-LD (thus, students may not double enter in Parli-LD and NFA-LD). The speech times are:

1. Government Constructive - Six (6) minutes. 2. Opposition Constructive – Seven (7) minutes. 3. Government Rebuttal - Five (5) minutes. 4. Opposition Rebuttal - Six (6) minutes 5. Government Rebuttal - Three (3) minutes.

### **NFA LD**

NFA Lincoln-Douglas Debate is a one-person, persuasive, policy debate on traditional stock issues. It is a communication event, by which we mean the philosophy of the activity is consistent with that which governs other individual events. Competitors in NFA Lincoln-Douglas will be evaluated on their analysis, use of evidence, and ability to effectively and persuasively organize, deliver, and refute arguments. Rapid-fire delivery, commonly called "spread delivery," is considered antithetical to the purpose and intent of this event.

### **JUDGING**

#### **Debate**

One judge is required for every two teams entered for parliamentary debate. One judge is required for every two debaters entered in NFA-LD on Sunday. Judges are required to judge one round beyond the elimination of their last team and all judges are committed through the first elimination round. There will be a charge of \$90 per team/L-D entry that is entered beyond your judging availability for both parliamentary debate, Parli LD and NFA-LD.

#### **Individual Events**

One judge is required for every five entries per pattern. ALL judges are committed through the final rounds. There will be a charge of \$12 per uncovered IE slot.

#### **Qualifications**

For the Open Division, we ask that all judges have an undergraduate degree or be at least two semesters removed from the open division. For the Novice division we ask that all judges be at least two semesters removed from novice competition.

Cerritos tournament staff reserves the right to make the final decision on judging qualifications. Novice judges may not cover open division entries.

#### **Hired Judges**

If you have judges available for hire please let us know and we may hire them. We will pay \$15 per debate round and \$10 per IE round.

### **AWARDS**

We will break to a bronze round in parliamentary debate and award the top ten speakers in each division. All IE finalists will receive awards.

Two categories of sweepstakes awards will be given out. The “Large Entry” category will be determined by counting the number of students entered by each school in the tournament as of Wednesday night. Fifty percent (plus ties) of the schools entered in the tournament will count as large entry.

The “Limited entry” category will consist of all the remaining schools. Novice division points will count 50% towards sweeps.

Sweepstakes will be calculated in the following manner:

Debate:

- 1) 1 point for each prelim win in debate for the four best teams per school.
- 2) 10 points for Gold, 5 points for Silver, 3 points for Bronze across all divisions.

Individual Events:

- 1) 10 points for 1st, 5 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, and 1 point for finalist.

## DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

### **Debate**

#### *Parliamentary Debate*

We will follow standard NPDA rules with time limits of 7-8-8-8-4-5 with 15 minutes of prep. The tournament will use a "strike system" for topics with the proposition striking one topic and the opposition striking another topic. The remaining topic will be the resolution for the round. No coaching will not be allowed during the 15 minutes of prep time.

#### *NFA-LD Debate*

We will follow standard NFA rules for NFA-LD with time limits of 6-3-7-3-6-6-3 with 4 minutes of preparation time for each debater. For more information on NFA-LD please visit: <http://www.socal-ld.net> REMINDER: This event is open to all college students with remaining debate eligibility.

### **Individual Events**

#### PATTERN A

Persuasive: An original, serious speech intended to convince an audience to accept an idea or adopt a policy of action. No more than 10% should be quoted. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.

Impromptu: An impromptu speech, serious in nature, with topic selection varied round by round, section-by-section. Speakers will have a total of 7 minutes and may use the time at their discretion.

Sports Impromptu: Will follow all the rules of impromptu except that all the topics will be sports themed. For example, "Who has the best chance of winning the 2011 NBA championship?"

Duo: Two persons from the same college performing a selection from any type of literature. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes. One person may not be in more than one Duo.

Programmed Oral Interpretation: A lecture-recital format composed of two or more selections from one or more authors, utilizing at least two different genres. Program should cohere in some manner but need not be thematic, i.e. "love", "war," "hate," etc. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.

**Dramatic Interpretation:** This event shall consist of a cutting or cuttings from a play, teleplay, or screenplay, featuring monologue or dialogue. If more than one selection is used, these selections should be linked by a thematic transition. All programs must include an introduction. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.

**Communication Analysis:** Analysis using rhetorical-communication principles. The analysis can be of a speech, speaker, movement, poster or other graphics, song, advertisement, play, poem, painting, etc. Maximum time is 10 minutes.

## **PATTERN B**

**Informative:** An informative speech (with or without visual aids) is intended to instruct an audience rather than reinforce or change an attitude. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.

**Extemporaneous:** Topics taken from the areas of national and international politics, economics, and international relations. Topics will be drawn from articles published in newsmagazines within the 90 days prior to the tournament. Maximum time limit is 7 minutes. Self-contained laptops may be used in the prep-room but a power source might not be available.

**Prose:** Prose shall consist of single or multiple selections of literature printed mainly in paragraph form, excluding drama. If more than one selection is used, these selections should be linked by a thematic transition. Use of manuscript is required. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.

**Poetry:** A selection or selections of poetry of literary merit, which may be drawn from more than one source. Play cuttings are prohibited. Use of manuscript is required. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes, including introduction and transitions.

**Speech to Entertain/ADS:** A humorous treatment of issues or events, avoiding material of questionable taste. The speech should be original rather than an imitation or impersonation of a comedian or monologue. Maximum time limit is 10 minutes.
