9. not because of their policy or expertise, therefore
10. **Be it Resolved**, by the Student Congress here assembled, that the United States government
11. should institute a two-term limit on members of the House of Representatives and
12. members of the Senate.

A Bill to Institutionalize Healthcare

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Federal Government shall mandate the institutionalized
3 turnover of any and all healthcare facilities to government operatives.

4 **SECTION 2.** “Healthcare facilities” are defined as hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

5 **SECTION 3. A.** This bill shall be enforced by the Department of Health and Human
6 Services.

7 **B.** Healthcare worker paychecks shall be issued by the above organization.

8 The same organization will provide for any medical costs of United
9 States’ citizens within the United States. Any facilities that fail to meet the
10 deadline shall be fined \$100,000 each month of tardiness.

11 **SECTION 4.** This law will take effect within six months of passage.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
