

Testimony | Christian Collins

JESUS served us, He died for us – so we serve Him by serving others

My name is Christian and I serve as Media Operator with the Hope Chapel Technical Team.

From Hope Chapel's origin in 1971 to 1992, there were no screens – at best, an overhead transparency projector displaying worship lyrics. The screens and media computer arrived in 1993 and as technology evolved, so did the church's use of computers and media.

In 1996, during my time with the Worship Ministry and as Pastor Alan Kisaka's assistant, the church started projecting the Scriptures and bulletin notes on the screens (still bring your Bibles, though). What started with PowerPoint evolved into specialized worship and presentation software paired with professional style equipment and many monitors.

As part of the Tech Team (which includes audio, video, and lighting) and working in conjunction with the Communications and Graphics Departments, the Media Operator prepares and screens everything that appears on all monitors. No Chat GPT, all human effort.

If you watch the livestream service, the videos that you see (at all stages of the service) need to be prepared, coded, and formatted for viewing. We use templates to ensure consistent messaging and formatting, while keeping the focus where it belongs – on God's Word and the care of His flock.

We liaise with many different pastors, personalities, and presenting styles...and occasionally have changes in the service schedule (the church equivalent of the football "audible"). By God's grace, it works.

As someone who has served in multiple ministries at Hope Chapel over the last 32 years, between here and Carson, my ministry philosophy has remained the same: Jesus served us – He died for us – so we serve Him by serving others. The "Rock" Apostle described it well in 1 Peter 4:10-11:

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies - in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. (ESV)


