The theme from camp focused on where our identity is found and whose image we are made in. Being reminded that there is no sin too great and that when we confess and lay our sinful burdens at Christ's feet, we are forgiven and become the "new image" that God intends us to be.

The theme of this year's winter camp was all about the "image of God." The camp's speaker emphasized that in the beginning, when God created man, He said "Let us make man in our

Camp also acts like a "reset" where you can separate yourself from distractions of life and focus on your relationship with God.

Each day we'd go to chapel twice, and we'd have some time in our cabins to talk about what our takeaways were. Cabin discussions were probably my favorite part of camp. Most of the time, one of the boys in our cabin would have a question or an insight that we would discuss for a while. We also got to bond as a small group by doing cool stuff like paintball, gagaball, and making s'mores, all while being in God's creation in the forest. It's easy to feel like God is nearer to you at camp.



We go to chapel twice a day, we talk about the sermons with each other, and we're away from our phones most of the time. But something that I'm always reminded of at camp is that God is with us everywhere, not just at a camp. We're told in **James 4:8**, "Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you." Just because our day-to-day lives look a little busier than life at winter camp, doesn't mean we can't draw close to God! So before we came back down the mountain, we were all encouraged to keep drawing close to God, and I think what we learned at Thousand Pines this year will help us do that.
