



THE WILD SIDE

Before sunrise and after sunset, along the waters of the Tonto National Forest and into the adjacent Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Reservation, visitors have a pretty good chance at catching a glimpse of Arizona's wild horse population. There are as many as 500 of these magnificent animals roaming the water's edge on the lower Salt River and the shoreline around Saguaro Lake. Their enigmatic presence is a common sight when visitors are kayaking, paddle boarding, or tubing down the river, as the horses emerge from the surrounding desert forest to cool off in the water and graze on the underwater foliage. According to historical records, the horses have been living on the Salt River reservation before the National Forest was created in the early 1900s. The wild horses are watched over by the tireless efforts of the Salt River Wild Horse Management Group. This non-profit is dedicated to the freedom of the wild horses, which has allowed them to live and wander peacefully over the years. If you are lucky enough to spot a horse or herd when you visit Mesa, remember to be respectful of their space and natural habitat. Snap the code to learn more.

AFTER SUNSET

A PERFECT NIGHT IN CITY LIMITLESS®

In Mesa, when the sun goes down the fun gets started. Whether you're looking for live music at a cozy venue, game night with friends or a chef-driven meal followed by craft brews, you'll find all manner of nighttime amusement in Mesa.

COCKTAIL HOUR

Kick off the evening with an expertly crafted cocktail. Adventurous drinkers will love the palate-pleasing creations at **Drunken Tiger,** a Korean restaurant that stirs up bevvies with Korean liquors like soju or the slightly sweet makgeolli. You can't go wrong with the Italian-themed drinks at Sam & Luca Rustic Kitchen. Favorites include the limoncello martini and the Americano – a mix of Campari, sweet vermouth and club soda. In east Mesa, local wines take center stage at Pour Wine & Taproom. At the always elegant **Board & Batten**, choose from throwback cocktails such as the Vesper (gin, vodka, Lillet Blanc) and the Sazerac.

DINE TIME

Foodies flock to **Tucked Away Craft Kitchen** for the restaurant's bold fusion of Asian, Spanish and New Mexican flavors. Go-to dish: A tie between the steamed buns and the green chile mac and cheese. For romantic sunset vistas that serve up bragging rights, reserve a table at **The Patio at Las Sendas Golf Club**. Situated 1,800 feet above Mesa and metro Phoenix, a dinner of filet mignon and sea scallops is sided with sparkling city views. Authentic Northern Italian dishes including seafood pastas and risottos never disappoint at **Alessia's Ristorante Italiano**.



CURTAIN CALL

Post-dinner, make your way to one of Mesa's esteemed venues for live performances that range from concerts and comedy to musicals and plays. Mesa Arts Center's year-round calendar includes jazz, classical and pop shows, Broadway theater, ballet, and more. A locally loved outdoor concert venue, Mesa Amphitheatre, brings in national and regional musical performers from a myriad of genres. Indie-rock fans tuck into **The Nile**, an intimate, historic space in Downtown Mesa. The newest spot for post-dinner laughs and more is Downtown Underground Mesa, located below 12 West Brewing Co. Come early, stay late - this joint is jumpin'.



ON TAP

Mesa's brew scene is buzzing with new spots opening up all the time. Continue your night on the town with a cold Hipsterville IPA at Barrio Brewing, the Mesa outpost of the oldest brewery in the state. The tap list at Old Ellsworth Brewing Company – Queen Creek's first brewery – hits all the right notes. Standouts include One Wild Rye'd, a rye IPA featuring Arizona wheat. Craft cider flows like water at Cider Corps; bonus points for late-night bites from the pizzeria. And in 2022, the newest location of Tempe-born Pedal Haus Brewery arrives in Mesa.

GAME ON

Round out the fun with bowling, arcade games, even a virtual reality (VR) experience. The Grid: Games & Growlers invites guests to play tabletop and console games, both new and classic, while sipping craft beer. Fun can be had at their weekly '80s themed game nights. It's unlikely you'll tire of the offerings at Jake's Unlimited – bowling, laser tag, VR – but if you do, there's always bumper cars or the spinning teacups to keep the adrenaline high. At FatCats, tee up for glow golf or take in a late movie before calling it a night. Experience Escape Rooms Mesa, the largest facility of its kind with varying levels of challenges for all.


THE MORNING AFTER: THE BEST BRUNCH SPOTS

Cap off a whirlwind evening with hearty next-day sustenance (and maybe a mimosa). The menu at TC Eggington's Brunchery is dense with delicious, egg-centric goodies. There are 13 omelette options alone! The cocktails list is almost as long as the brunch menu at What's Crackin' Café which makes it easy to mix and match your eats and drinks. Here, day drinkers unite, and the restaurant motto is "cheers and chug!" For a slower start to Sunday, head to the Queen Creek Olive Mill and take in local Arizona wines and over-the-top antipasto boards. Linger longer at this popular Fresh Foodie Trail® stop.



HOLE IN ONE

FAIRWAYS TO HEAVEN



There are more than 40 golf courses in Arizona's third-largest city, and every single one of them will offer a different view or unique shot-making choice unlike the other. Mesa is surrounded by mountain ranges that shape our northern, southern and eastern skylines and many of the area's tee boxes put players in front of sweeping vistas set against the natural beauty of the desert and blue Western skies. First on your tee sheet should be a round at Longbow Golf Club, which has also earned its share of praise after being recognized by Golfweek magazine as one of the top 20 courses in Arizona in their Best You Can Play, State by State ranking. Opt to play the course on a Longbow GolfBoard, a fun alternative to rolling the hills in a traditional cart. Save the date for the annual PING Heather Farr Classic hosted by the American Junior Golf Association each April, where future stars of the sport enjoy the spotlight. For a challenging round of desert golf check out Las Sendas Golf Club, which takes advantage of the breathtaking views of both Red Mountain and the Superstition Mountain range. Designed by Robert Trent Jones, Jr., the course has matured into one of the most beautiful courses in Arizona and ranks as one of the top 50 courses in the nation. Just north of the city is We-Ko-Pa Golf Club, developed by the Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation and managed by Troon Golf. Their two spectacular 18-hole layouts are certain to challenge and inspire golfers of all levels. We-Ko-Pa Golf Club is consistently ranked as one of the best, top 100 modern courses in Arizona. Mesa's own Dobson Ranch Golf Club is consistently ranked as the Best Municipal Golf Course in Arizona by Golf Digest. This 18-hole course plays 6,593 yards from the back tees to 5,598 yards from the front at par 72. For more than four decades, Dobson Ranch has been a prime golf location within Mesa. The course was designed in 1974 by American golf course architect Robert (Red) Lawrence, and today is enjoyed by thousands each year who love it for its challenging holes and friendly service. Mesa's own Augusta Ranch Golf Club is the top short course in the state with its par-61 golf course offering the perfect round for players of all abilities.

With PGA instructors on staff, visitors can sign up for a tune-up lesson before dusting off their clubs. In east Mesa, **Sunland Springs Golf Club** offers 27-holes with views in all directions of the Superstition Mountain range. The remodeled full-service pro shop and clubhouse can equip any visitor short on clubs and other must haves for a round in the desert. The Salt River community north of the city is home to **Talking Stick Golf Club**, a traditional links course with long tree-lined fairways. Featuring iconic design elements one would expect from a Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw designed course, visitors can sign up for their golf coaching program and enhance their skills while on vacation. For a fun, relaxed take on the sport, right around the corner is **TopGolf**, also part of the Talking Stick destination.
