LOCAL GENERAL RULES

IT IS THE INTENT OF THE DIVISION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS THAT THE QUALITY STANDARDS ESTABLISHED FOR LIVESTOCK ANIMALS BE MAINTAINED. THEREFORE, CLASSIFICATIONS WILL BE SUBJECT TO CHANGE IN THE EVENT THERE ARE CHANGES MADE IN FEDERAL GRADING.

1. All 2026 State Rules for California Fairs set forth by the California Department of Food & Agriculture, Division of Fairs and Expositions apply at the OC Fair.
2. All livestock entries must be completed online at ocfair.com/oc-fair/competitions-contests/animals/. Preregistration is required for all entries; no late entries will be accepted. All fees must be paid online; no checks accepted.
3. **ALL**, (excluding Rabbit & Cavy exhibitors - deadline: July 31), exhibitors are required to complete the following by **Wednesday, July 8**, in order to participate in the 2026 OC Fair:
 - Read all the rules stated in the competition guide.
 - Retain your **entry confirmation receipt** for a personal record of entries on file with the Livestock Office.
 - **State Rule for YOUTH:** As of January 1, 2019, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training is required for all youth livestock exhibitors. For more information and to sign-up, visit yqcaprogram.org/.
 - It is required that exhibitors complete their YQCA certification prior to completing entries for OC Fair Livestock competitions. Write down your certification number after completion and input the number (10-digit number code) in the YQCA box when completing entries in ShoWorks.
 - The first and last names on your ShoWorks entries must match **EXACTLY** to the name entered into the YQCA system.
4. **NEW: Exhibitors will NO longer be required to submit any paperwork to the Livestock Office. Instead, exhibitors will be required to sign an entry receipt/code of conduct during check-in at OC Fair .** Failure to do so will result in the loss of the exhibitor's ability to show in OC Fair competitions.
5. All entries must remain on display at OC Fair & Event Center as mandated by the dates set forth on page 2. Any entry removed prior to the release date and time shall be disqualified from any and all competitions and premiums therefore forfeited.
6. OC Fair & Event Center cannot legally carry insurance covering exhibitors and their exhibits. FFA chapters shall submit proof of insurance covering all members obtained through their school district. **Proof of insurance must be on file with the Livestock Office prior to arrival on the Fairgrounds.**
7. There is no limit on entries except as noted under the department headings. There is a limit of two cash awards per exhibitor, per class.
8. Youth exhibitors can enter only project units in which they are currently enrolled. Youth exhibitors must enter in youth divisions if they are available. If no Youth Divisions are available, then youth exhibitors may enter in Open Divisions. Exhibitors cannot enter in both Youth and Open divisions.
9. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through Dec. 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age in the Youth Division (State Rules, page 14, item 1 under Senior Department Restrictions), all others must enter Open.
10. Exhibitor's age as of July 17 (opening day of the 2026 OC Fair) must be specified on entry.
11. Breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening day of OC Fair (purchased by June 18) unless specified under specie rules.
12. Straw, shavings and alfalfa may be purchased through the Livestock Office between 7 and 8 a.m. each morning (Wednesday through Sunday, only). Times vary for Mondays and Tuesdays.
13. The OC Fair Livestock Department will have exclusive jurisdiction over the number of animals assigned to a pen and pen assignment.
14. Exhibitors are required to maintain clean barn and stall areas. All areas must be ready for inspection by 8 a.m. each day.
 - All exhibits not properly maintained may be cause for dismissal from the Fairgrounds and forfeiture of premiums.
 - All stalls **MUST** be cleaned upon departure.
15. Exhibitors are requested not to move animals unnecessarily, only to and from wash rack, tie rails and show ring. Exhibitors must clean up after themselves and their animals. **No animal is allowed to leave the designated livestock area without permission from the Livestock Supervisor.** Any flagrant disregard of this rule could result in being barred from showing and/or forfeiture of premiums.
16. Adults (non-exhibitor/leader/advisor/teacher/parents) are **NOT** allowed to assist in the fitting of animals for OC Fair & Event Center's youth shows. Fitting livestock is defined as preparing an animal for a show including, but not limited to, washing, blow drying, clipping, brushing or trimming. Livestock leaders and advisors may assist with the feeding and watering of animals. For the safety of all exhibitors and the public, adults may assist exhibitors and their animals to the scale, wash racks and show ring.

17. After the close of entries, Fair management reserves the right to combine classes and/or divisions if sufficient entries are not received. This combination may be made after papers are checked, in order to have an accurate number of entries. Fair management reserves the right to cancel any classes or divisions due to lack of entries.
18. The Livestock Department reserves the right to limit entries to facilities available, when necessary. All State Rules apply.
19. Vehicles may NOT be left unattended and must be removed from grounds after unloading. Violators will be ticketed and/or towed.
20. Livestock shall remain in the care, custody and control of the entrant. The entrant shall indemnify and hold harmless OC Fair & Event Center, its Board of Directors, employees, officers, agents or representatives for any injury, property damage and any real, incidental or consequential damages resulting from the livestock or caused by the livestock. OC Fair & Event Center will not be responsible for any loss or damage caused by or arising out of strikes, riots, lockouts or natural disasters.
21. All livestock entries are made with the distinct understanding that in no event will OC Fair become responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any livestock animal. Presentation of the entry shall be deemed acceptance of this rule.
22. There will be **NO REFUNDS OF PROCESSING FEES**, either for overpayment, duplicate entries, not showing or failure to bring in the entry.
23. Premium checks will be made payable to either the owner or exhibitor as stated on the entry. Total premiums of \$600 or more to any individual will be paid only after a completed *Payee Data Record* form has been received.
24. ALL EXHIBITORS are required to only use equipment that is properly grounded and meets UL specifications (i.e., clippers, blowers, heaters, vacuums, fans, etc.).
25. For the safety of exhibitors and the public, no food or drinks will be allowed in the Livestock Area. An area has been established for exhibitors to safely eat food at a safe distance from animals. Please note that the following items are NOT allowed in the designated picnic area: refrigerators, generators, or propane or charcoal BBQs.
26. **SECURITY:** Exhibitors are cautioned to keep equipment stored where it will not be lost or stolen. OC Fair & Event Center accepts no responsibility for any equipment, feed or supplies.
27. For the safety of exhibitors and OC Fair, exhibitors will be required to follow all established health and safety protocols listed on the exhibitor's entry receipt.
28. Exhibitors are encouraged to have educational displays to enhance the educational value of visiting OC Fair and exemplify the high caliber of the individuals participating in livestock shows, their animal projects and the agriculture industry in Orange County.
29. Only animals entered into Open, Youth and/or Adult show categories are allowed on OC Fair & Event Center property.
30. Exhibitors are NOT allowed to sell feed or items of any kind, nor solicit donations.
31. NO "FOR SALE" signs will be allowed on pens or cages at OC Fair.

POLICIES FOR THE CARE AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS

1. Fair management reserves the right to require health inspections and/or diagnostic tests to be made before, during or after animals are on the Fairgrounds and to implement disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies. The health of animals as determined by an official Fair veterinarian or by the judge shall be final and CANNOT be protested. Exhibitors who refuse to allow their animals to be examined shall be disqualified, animals will be removed from the Fairgrounds and such violations shall be reported to Fair & Expositions. No refunds will be granted.
2. Animals entered will be inspected by the official Fair veterinarian.
3. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed, water and care for any animal they have entered in the Fair for the duration of the show, through departure.
4. All large livestock exhibitors must supply their own feed and water receptacles. No pressurized water systems in any pens or cages are allowed.
5. No filling or feeding animals by artificial means will be allowed, including the use of tubes or drench guns.
6. Unruly animals will be removed at the discretion of the Livestock Supervisor.
7. Any alteration of appearance through physical change, removal, injection, or the use of paint, powder, dye, shoe polish, glue or artificial color is strictly prohibited.
8. A health certificate, where required, must be presented upon arrival at OC Fair. Please refer to the Animal Health Rules and State Rules.

YOUTH DEPARTMENT

The Youth Department is for qualifying individuals who want to enter OC Fair competitions. OC Fair & Event Center has established divisions and classes for groups such as FFA, 4-H clubs and the like. OC Fair & Event Center will provide opportunities for independent youth to exhibit in several ways. If few independents are entered, they may compete directly alongside organization members in the appropriate class. If enough are entered, separate classes will be formed for independent juniors.

In a livestock class, independent youth must meet the same age requirements as the direct competition members of an organization.

FFA MEMBERS may participate in classes if they are enrolled in high school agriculture classes and are active, dues-paying members of their FFA chapter. Active FFA members may exhibit projects until the end of the next calendar year following graduation.

4-H / GRANGE MEMBERSHIP enrollment is open to all youth from kindergarten through grade 12 through Dec. 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years old.

4-H PRIMARY members must be 5 years old or in kindergarten by Jan. 1 of the program year. Primary members cannot enroll in large animal projects. Approved animal projects are dogs, rabbits, rats, cats, poultry, caviae, mice, embryology, entomology, marine science, pygmy goats and therapeutic animal projects. Youth enrolling or turning 9 after Jan. 1 must participate as a primary member until the end of the program year.

INDEPENDENT YOUTH EXHIBITORS not affiliated with any organization may enter appropriate FFA and 4-H classes if they meet the required age or grade level. Fair management may establish separate classes if there are sufficient entries. Independent youth exhibitors must not have been enrolled in a junior organization within 60 days to be eligible to participate.

OTHER YOUTH EXHIBITORS may enter divisions and classes restricted to youth who are not under the FFA and 4-H youth programs or other recognized junior farm organization programs as independents. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through Dec. 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years old. Each entry in these divisions must have been made or produced by the exhibitor. Entries shall be made on youth department entry forms provided by the Fair. The signature of a parent or guardian is required. State and local rules applying to all entries and scorecards in corresponding Senior and Junior classes shall be used unless otherwise provided in these divisions. Exhibitors who are enrolled in any junior organization for which classes are offered elsewhere are not eligible to enter these divisions.

YOUTH & ADULT UNIFORM STANDARDS

UNIFORM: All national FFA Organization and 4-H Club and Grange exhibitors must wear the official uniform of their organization while showing. FFA uniforms are to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at OC Fair & Event Center Livestock Department shows. The official uniforms are as follows:

FFA Uniform

- Boys – Dark blue, black or white pants, white shirt, FFA tie and official FFA jacket (zipped to the top) or FFA patch attached to the white shirt.
- Girls – Dark blue, black or white pants, white blouse, FFA scarf and official FFA jacket (zipped to the top) or FFA patch attached to the white blouse.

4-H Uniform

- Boys – Dark blue, black or white pants, white collared shirt (any sleeve length) and 4-H Club cap (4-H tie or scarf is optional).
- Girls – Dark blue, black or white pants, white collared blouse (any sleeve length) and 4-H Club cap (4-H tie or scarf is optional).

Grange Uniform

- White collared button-down shirt, dark blue jeans and red vest with Grange emblem on the back.

Independent Uniform

- Dark blue, black or white pants and white collared shirt.

Open Exhibitor Uniform

- Clean white top, show whites or team uniform.

NO attendant or other person will be allowed in the show ring unless neatly dressed in proper uniform.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)
CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expos* and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Avian Knowledge Bowl (Avian Bowl) encourages youth to study the many aspects of avian sciences. The contest was developed in California by John Emo, Dr. Ralph Ernst and Dr. Francine Bradley.

1. This is a **TEAM** contest. One entry per team, 2-4 participants per team. **NO INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES.**
2. Entries should be entered under the team captain.
3. 4-H/FFA uniform must be worn or a team shirt.

1. Open to youth, ages 18 and under, including but not limited to, OC Fair breeding animal exhibitors. Animals **MUST** be entered in a competition the week of the show. Absolutely **NO** outside animals allowed.
2. Registration is done at the Livestock Office prior to the parade, until 3 p.m. the day of the parade.
3. Owners/participants dress up and parade the animals in the Livestock show ring for a fashion review and judging.

5. Only animals entered in the show are allowed on OC Fair & Event Center property.

3. Only animals entered in the show are allowed on OC Fair & Event Center property.
4. All birds must be identified by leg bands conforming to the entry form, upon arrival at the show.
5. **Poultry Health Inspection (PHI)** – All exhibitors shall have their poultry inspected for symptoms of disease or illness upon arrival and prior to coop-in. Poultry not passing inspection must be removed from the premises immediately by the owner or housed in a designated quarantine area. **Poultry must have a leg band to be inspected.** Exhibitors who do not arrive and have their birds inspected during the scheduled PHI (refer to the timetable on page 2) CANNOT make any other arrangements for a future inspection and will be ineligible to show.
6. **BOTH youth and adult exhibitors** can enter in the open division since no youth division is offered.
7. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the birds will be counted as an entry.
8. Entries will be separated into divisions and classes based on breed and classes entered, once entries close.
9. Exhibitors must list the breed, variety, leg band, division and class number of each bird on the entry form.
10. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards will be made.
11. Entries shall be limited to facilities available and will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Entries and fees will be returned when capacity is reached.
12. All eggs laid at OC Fair become the property of OC Fair.

4. Original registration papers must be present at check-in and remain available throughout the show; copies are not accepted.
5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and follow the NPGA show rules. For a copy of the rules, visit: npga-pygmy.com/wp-content/uploads/2024/02/Show-Rules-Updated-June-2023.pdf.
6. Participation is open to all owners of NPGA registered pygmies upon receipt of proper registrations and fees.
7. All entries in the SCPGC hosted show(s) must be entered and shown in OC Fair show(s) in their respective class(es). NO additional animals will be allowed to enter, unless the animal in question was not entered and shown due to the animal being in the fair judges' herd name.

2. This is a sanctioned show and is recognized by the ILR-SD. ILR-SD rules, definitions and judging procedures govern provided they do not conflict with Division of Fairs or Department of Food and Agriculture rules and regulations.
3. ILR-SD requires a \$3 fee per animal entered (e.g., three llamas entered incur a fee of \$9). The fee is due at the time of check-in and payable to ILR-SD. Only cash or check accepted.
4. Original International Llama Registry (ILR) certificates required at check-in.
5. Owner/exhibitor information must match entry and registration paperwork.
6. Llamas may be shown in youth or adult performance classes but NOT both.
7. For Youth Divisions, the same llama may be used by two separate exhibitors as long as they are entered into different age classes from one another.
8. If there are less than six entries in any two youth divisions, the youth divisions may be combined.
9. Pens are typically 10-by-10 feet and 5 feet high. Space is limited.
10. All llamas shall be presented for judging with a halter and lead rope and no additional decorations, including but not limited to: tassels, pompoms or other removable decorations.
11. Crias may not accompany nursing alpaca or llama mothers; it is recommended not to show nursing mothers.
12. Fair staff or the judge may dismiss unruly animals from the ring. Animals may be dismissed even prior to entering the ring if deemed unruly.
13. All llamas must be shown in the correct age and sex classification.
14. Llamas may be entered in only one halter class or wool division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to place their llama in the correct division and class.

3. **NEW:** The OC Fair will be hosting two NMDA sanctioned shows. There will be a full day of showing on Friday, July 31, then repeat the same classes Saturday, Aug. 1, with a different judge. Costume contest will only be Saturday, Aug. 1. Premiums are only offered for Show B on Saturday, Aug. 1.
4. NMDA requires a fee of \$2 per miniature donkey due at the time of check-in. Cash only.
5. Classes are open to miniature donkeys registered with the Miniature Donkey Registry (MDR), the American Donkey Registry (ADR) or the Canadian Donkey & Mule Association (CDMA). Unregistered Miniature Donkeys will not be allowed to show.
6. All miniature donkeys must be registered prior to the show. Exhibitors must enter the registered name (animal name) and number (tag ID) of the miniature donkey as it is shown on the animal's registration certificate. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration certificate. Copies of registration certificates will be accepted.
7. Maximum height for animals entered in the NMDA Miniature Donkey classes is 36 inches. Donkeys will be measured Wednesday, July 29 at 6 p.m.
8. The age of a miniature donkey, for the purpose of entering this competition, will be determined by its actual birth date. Foals must be a minimum of six months of age based off of the first day of the OC Fair Miniature Donkey Competitions (born before Jan. 16, 2026) and all donkeys in jumping and/or driving classes must be three years of age or older.
9. Stud chains are required for all jacks shown in halter classes regardless of age or temperament.
10. Western wear will be accepted as proper show attire.
11. Youth Exhibitors: Competitors 17 years of age and under may not show a jack two years or older in any NMDA class. The age of an individual on Jan. 1 of the calendar year will be the base age for competing.
12. High Point Awards: Pursuant to NMDA rules, it is necessary that jacks/jennies be entered, shown and judged in at least one halter (conformation) class to be eligible for Performance High Point award consideration. It is not necessary for geldings to enter or show in a conformation halter class to be eligible for any of the Performance High Point awards.

High Point Calculation: For classes of five or more animals, first place will receive five points, with the remaining places receiving one less point in descending order. For classes of less than five animals, first place will receive points equal to the number in the class, with the remaining places receiving one less point in descending order.

- **Ties:** High point ties will be broken by the number of first places, then by number of classes placed in, then by the highest placing in Pleasure Driving (or in hand and trail for nondriving divisions).
- To be eligible for any of the High Point awards, the miniature donkey (or team) must be duly entered, shown and judged in classes to be considered for any high point award. Placings in Championship Halter classes will not be counted toward any High Point award.
