13	The mission of the OCFEC is celebration of
14	Orange County's communities, interests, agriculture, and
15	heritage with results justifying resources expended. We
16	will now move to the Pledge of Allegiance. And if I can
17	have Director Bagneris lead us, please.
18	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: Yes. Good morning. Everyone,
19	place your right hand over your heart and repeat with me.

21	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you. And now we will go ahead
22	and move to roll call. Summer, please.
23	MADAM SECRETARY: Chair Cervantes?

13	Now we over to Matters of Public Comment. Public
14	comment is allowed on issues not on the current agenda;
15	however, no debate by the Board shall be permitted on such
16	public comments and no action will be taken on such public
17	comments items at this time, as law requires formal public
18	notice prior to any action on the docket item.
19	Speakers are requested to sign in prior to the
20	start of the meeting and are limited to three minutes.
21	Comments will be conducted in agenda items during the
22	meeting. People wishing to address the Board on the items
23	on the agenda are requested to sign in prior to the start
24	of the meeting and identify the agenda items on which you
25	desire to address the Board. Speakers are limited to

1 three minutes. We will go ahead and move directly to the 2 3 Governance Process. And this is an action item. 4 Consideration of and Vote on Whether Or Not to Cancel the 2020 OC Fair. And we can start with public comment on 6 this one. MADAM SECRETARY: We're going to start with public comment. Doctor Horn -- Doctor Horn, if you are ready to 9 speak, please, go ahead. 10 DOCTOR HORN: Thank you very much. I'm Doctor Horn. 11 I'm a veterinarian. I do work with the forage group here 12 in Orange County. 13 I think that holding the OC fair as it normally 14 is creates significant health risks to everyone in the County; however, I think that there's a possibility of 15 16 having the livestock shows only using appropriate social 17 distancing and wearing masks, for the benefit of the 18 children as long as the Governor, you know, changes the 19 stay-at-home laws by July. That's my comment. that's the best situation for the kids. It's to be able 20 to perform (unintelligible). Thank you. 21 22 MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you. Vincent Pollmeier, when 23 you're ready. 24 MR. POLLMEIER: Thank you, Summer. This is 25 Vincent Pollmeier from Friends and Neighbors of the

Orange County Fairgrounds.

Just to put things into context, some time later today or early tomorrow, the United States is going pass a grim milestone. In just a matter of few months, we will have lost more Americans to COVID-19 than were lost in the nearly 20 years of the war in Vietnam.

And if we're not careful and do not act prudently and we're not serious in our efforts, we are in jeopardy of surpassing the American death toll from the First World War in just a matter of a few weeks or a month.

The philosopher and writer George Santayana wrote that "those who do not remember the past, are condemned to repeat it." And the history of the 1918-1919 -- and I emphasize, that was a two-year influenza pandemic -- is replete with examples of public bodies that prematurely opened events and venues only to see those actions result in explosive new spread of disease, in spite of the death toll. And that's not what we want the OC Fair to be known for.

We should cancel the fair this year. And with all due respect to the prior speaker, I don't think we can safely and without any risk do any part of the fair. We should cancel it, and we should cancel our other bookings upcoming over the summer if they cannot be held in

1 absolute safety. I just want to go on to then suggest that we 2 3 should then -- the Fairgrounds should then task the staff 4 to use the time made available by these cancellations to review the events of the past two years, generate an assessment and breakdown of where and how the Fairgrounds 6 7 is making its money, where its expenses are. 8 And when we have that information, staff should 9 work with our partner like Tandem and Spectra to determine 10 how we might hold events in safety -- in the future -- and what that would mean for changes to the way facilities are 11 12 laid out, our ways of doing business, and what the impact 13 on profit and loss would be. 14 We need to prepare for a very, very hazy and 15 uncertain future. And that preparation is going to 16 require us to know a lot about our tax practices. 17 will require agility and out-of-the-box thinking. 18 But we must recognize that we won't be returning 19 to anything like the old ways of doing business for a very 20 long time, if ever. So thank you. And, again, I encourage you for 21 the good of the public and for safety -- which has to be 22 23

our absolute paramount concern -- cancel the fair. Thank you.

MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you, Vincent. Pam Jones, when

1	you're ready to speak.
2	SPEAKER: Mom.
3	MS. JONES: Yeah. This Pam Jones. And I'm a
4	long-time vendor at the Orange County Fair. I've been
5	there for many, many years.
6	And I, too, you know, obviously would like to
7	protect all of us from this virus; however, at this time,
8	more than two-and-a-half months away from fair time, I
9	think it's premature to make a definite cancellation of
10	the fair, but it's not premature to make a definite
11	stipulation with a timeline.
12	Something, like, unless California has reopened
13	its social distancing requirements listed by let's say
14	the first weekend in June which is still a
15	month-and-a-half more than a month-and-a-half prior to
16	fair time unless those have happened, then the fair
17	would have to be canceled by that time.
18	So that is just, you know, my suggestion. To
19	make a stipulation of cancellation by a certain date if
20	things have not changed, rather than cancelling at this
21	time. Thank you.
22	MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you. Jeremy Cates, when
23	you're ready to speak.
24	MR. CATES: Hi there. Thank you for giving me this
25	opportunity.

1 First of all, I'd like to echo Doctor Horn. How -- I think running the Orange County Fair the way 2 we've run in the past is a very big mistake. distancing would not be possible. 4 But if we could do something for the kids, maybe just something just for the livestock. We've all been 6 7 affected by this. Students have poured tons of time, 8 money, effort into their projects and giving them an 9 ability to turn these projects, finish the project, and 10 send them on their way. Schools, businesses, have all begun to do things 11 12 differently. And I think that we can still do an 13 Orange County Fair Livestock Auction just by doing it a 14 little differently. So cancelling outright would be a 15 mistake. Maybe going forward in a different direction is 16 what I would urge us do in this uncertain time. 17 That's all I have to say. Thank you very much. 18 MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you. Gina Montes, when you're 19 ready. 20 MS. MONTES: Hello. I'd like to thank Mr. Cates for pointing out how much the kids have put into their 21 project. I have -- I run La Habra Hilltoppers. We live 22 23 on three acres from La Habra Heights. I have over 10 --24 over \$100,000 worth of livestock sitting on my property. 25 My kids have worked so hard and they continue to come up

1	and take care of their animals, practice social
2	distancing, feed, water, bathe do everything that you
3	need to do.
4	I've invited Brooke Day who is a student and who
5	also (unintelligible) to be on our call because she was
6	very instrumental in getting the other county fair to go
7	virtual because their fair is coming up this weekend and
8	had an online option.
9	If anything, if we could move in that direction.
10	I know the gentleman who runs the next level camp is
11	sitting on on virtual and also Ryan Rash is holding
12	a national cattle show.
13	If we can't have just the livestock portion at
14	Orange County, we need to do something for these kids.
15	You know, we can't as adults tell them we have to
16	give up and we can't find an alternative for them because
17	what are we teaching them as adults? Throw your hands in
18	the air and walk away? You know, they're expecting all
19	the scientists to find a cure. Well, we need to find a
20	cure for these kids. Thank you.
21	MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you. Chair Cervantes, that's
22	all we have for public comment.
23	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you, Summer.
24	Okay. So with a heavy heart, I move the 2020
25	Fair be canceled due to the pandemic and the restrictions
	Page 11

1	of the large gatherings and in the safety of the community
2	is our main priority.
3	SPEAKER: Cancel.
4	SPEAKER: Cancel. Yep.
5	CHAIR CERVANTES: Let me know if there's a second.
6	DIRECTOR AITKEN: This is Ashleigh Aitken, and I
7	second.
8	DIRECTOR LA BELLE: Chair Cervantes, if we have
9	Michele put something on the staff report and provide some
10	background as to timing relative to the importance of
11	moving forward, sooner rather than later, in terms of our
12	decision. And this is outlined in her staff report and
13	she can speak to that.
14	And Mr. Pollmeier raised some extra points and I
15	know that Michele is working on a move-forward business
16	plan, and if she can speak to that briefly as well as the
17	staff report. That would be my request.
18	CHAIR CERVANTES: Absolutely.
19	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: This is Director Bagneris. I'd
20	also like to speak to the possibility of an online option.
21	That would be also helpful.
22	MS. RICHARDS: Chair Cervantes, I'm happy to this
23	is Michele Richards I'm happy to give that agenda
24	report now.
25	Obviously, all of us have been watching the news
	Page 12

1 and there's lots of new information coming out on a daily basis, both at the local and State and Federal levels. 2 3 We've been looking at all of that information and we offer two pieces of specific information; one from our 4 government officials and the other from our local public health officer in Orange County. 6 7 (Multiple speakers) Again, if we could ask everyone to please --8 9 (Multiple speakers) 10 -- could we please ask everyone to mute their 11 phones. Thank you. 12 During his April 14th press conference, 13 Governor Gavin Newsom stated, quote, "The prospect of mass 14 gatherings is negligible at best until we get immunity and 15 we get to a vaccine. Large-scale events that bring in 16 hundreds, thousands, tens of thousands of strangers are 17 not in the cards based upon our current guidelines and 18 current expectations." 19 The Governor continued specifying that large 20 gatherings in June, July, and August are/were unlikely. He added that the ability to develop therapeutics to meet 21 the demand and the ability to support physical distancing 22 will determine when mass gatherings can return. 23 24 In addition, the executive management team 25 teleconferenced with the Orange County Health Care

1 Agency's Public Health Officer, Doctor Nicole Quick. During the call, Doctor Quick agreed that it would be 2 3 prudent at this time for the Board of Directors to consider cancellation of the 2020 OC Fair. 4 She added, quote, "It is not likely that we would 6 be in place to hold a fair in July. Mass gathering 7 regulations will be in place for a very long time," 8 unquote. 9 In addition, Doctor Quick agreed that it would be 10 nearly impossible to achieve proper social distancing at the Fair and large gatherings like the Fair will likely 11 12 not take place until effective treatments or a vaccine are 13 in place. 14 Staff would also like to add that we have already received lots and lots of comments on our website and 15 16 social media regarding the particular item that the Board 17 is considering today. And you can imagine that guests are 18 reacting to the possibility of the Fair being canceled. 19 It's great to see how many fans we have out there. 20 for the most part, the public is understanding and quite 21 supportive. 22 We would also like to indicate to the public that the staff -- in coordination with the Board of 23 24 Directors -- will be working on ideas to keep the Fair 25 alive, to keep as much as we can -- present in our guests'

1	mindset as we go through the year. What we can do online.
2	What we can do through social media to bring joy, to bring
3	that piece of the Fair to everyone. We will be working
4	diligently to do that.
5	One of the pieces is looking at how we can still
6	hold a Junior Livestock Auction. We have received
7	information from the State of California about how to do
8	that safely and effectively online, for example.
9	So please know that our livestock team is working
10	on that diligently and we'll be putting information out
11	about that as soon as possible.
12	Happy to answer any questions that the Board
13	might have at this time.
14	DIRECTOR RUIZ: Yeah. Michele, this is Director Ruiz.
15	If if during the livestock, you know, the idea
16	has been kicked around about having possibly only the
17	livestock you know, some of these kids who have worked
18	very hard on this project can attend what would be the
19	approximate attendance if that was to take place, Michele?
20	Would you know off the top of your head?
21	MS. RICHARDS: Doctor or Doctor Director Ruiz,
22	we're still assessing that. We're not at all certain that
23	that in-person livestock auction would be safe for anyone
24	in attendance, including the kids, the parents, the
25	agriculture leaders livestock leaders and our own

1 staff. And so until we can come up with those -- assess 2 3 those guidelines from the State; however, there is the 4 option that the State is giving to do an online option so that the kids can still participate and the public can 6 still participate. So we just received those last week 7 and we're looking onto all of that just now. DIRECTOR RUIZ: Okay. Great. Thank you. 9 VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Michele, this is 10 Director Rubalcava. MS. RICHARDS: 11 Yes. 12 VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Can you highlight some 13 of the things that we might be able to do virtually. 14 Like, some of the contests or competitions that are 15 currently held at the Fair. 16 MS. RICHARDS: Absolutely. Obviously, the one of the 17 highlights of the Fair are the competitive entries where 18 members of the public enter their -- their handmade items, 19 their paintings, their crafts -- into competitions at the 20 We are looking into how to do that virtually as well, so that people can still enter. 21 22 We can look at showcasing those beautiful items 23 online. There are other ways that we can bring some 24 entertainment through our website to our guests. 25 again, all of these ideas are being developed by staff and Page 16

1	we'll be putting more information out as those plans
2	unfold.
3	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: Director Cervantes, this is
4	Director Bagneris.
5	CHAIR CERVANTES: Yes.
6	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: Yeah. So if we vote for the
7	motion to cancel the Fair, those other activities can
8	still come about without affecting the vote again? I just
9	want to make sure.
10	CHAIR CERVANTES: Oh, absolutely.
11	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: Okay. With that, then I would
12	like to call the question into the motion.
13	VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: I second. This is
14	Director Rubalcava.
15	DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: It's already been moved and
16	second, so I think we should move to the vote, unless the
17	directors
18	CHAIR CERVANTES: Summer, will you please. No, we're
19	good. Thank you.
20	MADAM SECRETARY: No problem. Chair Cervantes?
21	CHAIR CERVANTES: Yes.
22	MADAM SECRETARY: Vice Chair Rubalcava-Garcia?
23	VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Yes.

17	priority is always the safety of the public and anybody
18	who enters our Fairgrounds.
19	This would have been my 25th consecutive year in
20	the Fair, and, unfortunately, it's not going to happen.
21	My heart breaks for all the kids who look forward to these
22	summer jobs, you know, to go work at the OC fair.
23	You know, it really brings me joy when I drive
24	around Santa Ana and I see these kids waiting on the bus
25	with OC Fair shirts waiting to go to the Fair. All that,

1 it -- it breaks my heart. It really does. But at the end of the day, like some of the speakers said, we don't know 2 what this is going to look like two months from now or six 4 months from now. I would hate for an outbreak of the pandemic to come back during fair time. 6 You know, again, the number one priority here for 7 us is the safety and the well-being of the public. And 8 that is the reason why I'm voting no. As much as it 9 hurts, but it's the right decision and it is the 10 responsible thing to do. Thank you. CHAIR CERVANTES: Okay. Director Bagneris? 11 DIRECTOR BAGNERIS: I echo what Director Ruiz has 12 13 And I know I heard these comments, too, as much as 14 it would be. But death is not something that I signed up 15 for and the possibility of it. We don't know who has this 16 virus, and I think our number one concern on this Board 17 has always been safety and security. It's our number one 18 priority. 19 We can't be safer than doing what we're doing today. Even though it's hard, I'm sure that this is not 20 the first time that the Fair has had to (unintelligible). 21 We're going to come back stronger next year than the year 22 We have even more reason to do that. 23 before. So I thank the Board for their consideration and 24 25 thoughtful consideration and critical consideration to do

1 what we've done today. And I believe that we've done the 2 right thing. So I thank every Board member and every 3 person. Our staff, I know it's hard on them, but life is 4 more important than anything else. CHAIR CERVANTES: Director Aitken? 6 DIRECTOR AITKEN: Yes. Thank you so much to all the work that the staff has put into this. Obviously, we are all heartbroken as an 8 9 organization. We had to make this decision, and I just 10 want to emphasize, obviously, the public safety is our 11 number one priority and always has been. 12 And because of the timeline where we need to let 13 people know, we haven't dropped (unintelligible) but we 14 had to make a decision. So while I'm very sensitive to the public (unintelligible) wait and see as a business 15 16 decision as well, we are just not in a position to do 17 that. 18 I am very hopeful. I know that the Board has been very engaged with staff about trying to look at our 19 options. Following the lead with the Department of 20 Agriculture about how we can help out our forage and FFA 21 22 families. And, you know, look at ways we can still do 23 some of the artistic competitions. 24 We are going to do everything we can to try to 25 keep the spirit of the Fair alive. We're just not in a

1	position right now to make guarantees. But we are really
2	going to do everything we can to have a presence this
3	summer. It will be different but the spirit of the Fair
4	will be there. And I really look forward to working with
5	staff and doing some creative things to to keep the
6	Fair in people's hearts.
7	CHAIR CERVANTES: Director Pham?
8	DIRECTOR PHAM: I think Ashleigh said pretty much
9	everything I would like to say. So, unfortunately, yeah.
10	I agree with everyone.
11	CHAIR CERVANTES: Okay. Director La Belle?
12	DIRECTOR LA BELLE: Ditto all of the earlier comments.
13	In the past, we've always had safety first over
14	and above all other properties. I think it's very
15	important that we emphasize that.
16	There are, as we all know, many a large group
17	of venues that are currently not operating. And I think
18	we all hope that a process whereby it will be able to
19	control this horrendous virus when it does strike and our
20	ability to then vaccinate in the future to preclude this
21	from ever occurring again.
22	I do thank the staff and my fellow directors for
23	all of their hard work. I know Michele and Ken and all of
24	the staff have worked very hard to secure the facility.
25	And I look forward to the opportunities that might exist

1	or some activities that will keep the OC Fair and
2	everybody's minds and thoughts and process. So with that,
3	I appreciate that. Thank you.
4	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you.
5	Director Rubalcava-Garcia?
6	VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Thank you,
7	Chair Cervantes.
8	I agree with all my colleagues as well. This is
9	a very hard decision to make. But I also think it gives
10	us an opportunity to get creative. And I'm sure how
11	resilient Orange County is, I'm excited to see what ideas
12	that the Board and the staff come up with to make sure
13	that we're still representing the OC Fair and bringing the
14	community together, whether it's virtually and just also
15	creating some potential opportunities for keeping up the
16	development, even if it's not at the level that we've been
17	able to contribute to the economy in the past.
18	But I'm excited to see what we can come up with
19	and I'm looking forward to an even better fair in 2021.
20	Thank you.
21	CHAIR CERVANTES: Okay. Thank you.
22	All right. So I agree with everybody. This is
23	very, very difficult. And I know that we will be back on
24	track in 2021, as long as large gatherings are permitted
25	at that time.

And as Director Rubalcava-Garcia said, I am sure that together we can create a lot of excitement and come up with an amazing virtual concept and keeping the spirit of the OC Fair alive. And with safety first, I thank our staff for all their incredible hard work and wish everybody a happy Mother's Day. Thank you all. meeting's adjourned. (Meeting adjourned at 9:34 a.m.) Page 23
