Beginning on Saturday, June 6th, the OC Fair & 8 Event Center parking lot has been transformed into the 9 10 most amazing emergency food assistance operation thanks to 11 a partnership between OC Food Bank and the Power of One 12 Foundation. Since that time, in just six Saturdays of 13 14 operation, they have provided free, farm fresh produce 15 meat, cheese, and milk and some of that produce coming from Centennial Farm, by the way, to 23,499 households 16 17 that's representing 117,495 individuals that have been 18 served. 19 The man behind this amazing community service 20 work is Andre Roberson, the Executive Director of the 21 Power of One Foundation which is a non-profit that aims to 2.2 fight hunger and poverty through food assistance. And I 23 see Andre is on the call with us today. I just wanted to 24 thank you, Andre -- on behalf of our staff and Board of 25 Directors. Many of whom have been volunteering with us on

1	Saturdays and the whole community for your service.
2	We're very happy to be a part of it. So thank you so
3	much, Andre. I don't know if you want to say a few words.

website. And our staff has begun to reach out to those

vendors and will do so over the next couple of days.

We are in final preparations for use of the

OC Fair & Event Center as a large-scale COVID testing site

We are in final preparations for use of the OC Fair & Event Center as a large-scale COVID testing site by the OC Health Care Agency. There is a significant need in Orange County -- as we've all read -- to step up the testing. And as part of our emergency use agreement with the county, we are activating for this purpose beginning in early August.

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The current agreement with the county is for medical response to a bioterrorism emergency. On the Consent Calendar today is an amendment to that agreement to allow for use of the fairgrounds by the county for any health related emergency, including what we're experiencing right now.

We have alerted our partners at the City of Costa Mesa and the Equestrian Center and we will provide details to the surrounding community when available. The testing is scheduled to take place daily from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for 60 days, and it's by appointment only. And those being tested will not be

allowed to leave their vehicle.

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On another emergency use note: Unfortunately, the previously scheduled blood drives with the American Red Cross have been put on hold for now. We've been having some challenges with them signing our COVID waivers. But we all hope to have that worked out soon so the blood drive can be rescheduled as soon as possible.

Yesterday afternoon, Bobby McDonald, President and Executive Director of the Black Chamber of Commerce, received a framed copy of the OCFEC Board of Directors Solidarity Proclamation. And you can see that presentation in front of The Hangar building. We were properly distant and wearing masks. A copy of the proclamation is also framed and displayed in our OC room for everyone to see when it's safe to hold our in-person Board meetings again.

Next Friday and Saturday night, the Fab Four will appear live and in-person at OC Fair & Event Center when the first Autosonic Concert debuts. Ticket holders will arrive in their vehicles and remain in their vehicles during the live performance of one of concert goers favorite tribute bands. This is the first in a series of shows that we hope to host at OCFEC put on by Autosonic Concert. Tickets are still available for next weekend. So check out our website for that.

1 And stay tuned for more fun this summer as our 2. staff continues to work on plans for hosting drive-in movies and fair food eats and treats. The hurdles with 3 the Health Department and State Fire Marshal are proving 4 to be very challenging, but we are making progress. 6 stay tuned, everyone. Life goes on at Centennial Farm -- abundantly -in anticipation of re-opening Centennial Farm once it's safe to do so. Our farm crew has built this amazing red 9 10 barn handwashing station that you see on the left-hand 11 side of the screen. And look at those seven crates of 12 peppers that were just harvested from the farm. were all donated to OC Food Bank and some of them even 13 14 ended up in the crates of food that were given out last 15 Saturday during the food distribution. We have a new litter of piglets that is due next 16 17 week, and a calf due the first week of August. Their fans 18 can watch the current litter of piglets any time through 19 the pig cam on our website. 20 And last but certainly not least, we kicked off 21 the 2020 OC Virtual Fair last Friday and we're having a 2.2 ton of fun with it. Joan will be up later in the meeting 23 to give everyone a brief update. 2.4 Now, for our current financial. Year-to-date, 25 June 2020 revenue is unfavorable to budget by \$4.1

1 million. Not unexpected. This is wholly due to effect of business cancellations and the cancellation of the fair 3 due to COVID-19. 4 Some revenue was recognized from June. There 5 were storage fees from Cirque de Soleil and rents for the 6 fireworks stand in addition to the Equestrian Center --7 rental. Expenses are favorable by \$5 million. Management continues to look for ways to decrease our operating 8 9 expenses. 10 So for the year-to-date period ending June 30th, 11 year-to-date net proceeds are actually favorable to budget 12 by \$920,000. A re-forecast as of June accompanied our 13 financials this month. And as I reported last month, it's 14 our plan to continue to report out on a monthly basis what 15 our re-forecast will be. So looking at six months of actuals and then six 16 17 months of projected revenue and expenses, we now project a 18 net deficit against our budget of \$17,305,852 which is 19 actually an improvement from last month of 791,000. 20 Okay. Cash-on-hand. Total cash and cash 21 equivalence is now at 48,687,505. That is a 9.93 percent 2.2 year-over-year decrease. Additionally, our interest rate 23 earnings continue to decrease as does our (unintelligible) 24 you can see. 25 Again, keeping the board and public aware of our Page 11

1	ongoing financial status each month, we now project an
2	ending cash and cash equivalent balance at the end of 2020
3	to be \$37,813,499.
4	And I think we can all agree with Doc Brown from

7	accordingly.

22	Fairgrounds and Spectra.
23	We need you to come to an agreement so that we
24	can get back to work when it is safe to do so. Individual
25	vendors are hundreds of thousands of dollars in debt

1 because merchandise has to be purchased so far in advance. 2. For example, spring and summer clothing lines must be purchased in the winter. Obviously, COVID-19 was 3 an unexpected event. When we first closed, I believe it 4 would be for a few weekends and we would re-open in April. 6 Well, here we are five months later stuck in limbo. The swap meet is a community institution, albeit, a smaller one than in years past. We are still the 8 9 Fairgrounds' longest tenant. The Market Place is still 10 larger than South Coast Plaza, and we generate hundreds of 11 thousands of tax dollars to local and state government 12 each and every year. 13 I said it before and I'll repeat it again: 14 Everyone across the country is doing all they can in this 15 time of COVID-19 to save small businesses. Somebody just 16 mentioned Newton Pham talking about a small business that 17 he, himself, in the banking industry is helping save, yet we are still out of work. 18 19 It is -- contracts are being renegotiated, rental 20 payments are being waived, help is being provided, and yet we are still out of work. Please come to an agreement. 21 2.2 We need to get back to work. Thank you. 23 MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you, Jeanine. Mike Robbins, 24 when you're ready. 25 MR. ROBBINS: Hi. This is Mike. You know, the Fair Page 15

1	Board members and everybody really know what's going on.
2	Since the last Fair Board meeting, more people have died
3	in the United States than died in the D-Day invasion.
4	2,500 men died in the D-Day invasion. Thousands of people
5	thousands of people died yesterday. 50,000 people died
6	in World War I our soldiers. 50,000 men died in
7	Vietnam. 144,000 people have died in this COVID-19. This
8	is the greatest crisis of our lifetime, and they're
9	arguing over some rent at Market Place which is just
10	that's just insane.
11	You got \$50 million in the bank and they're
12	talking about, "Oh, get some money from Spectra." These
13	are Market Place vendors. When they go back to work, they
14	have to know there's going to be something there. It
15	shouldn't be about money. It should be about how much
16	you're going to pay the Market Place vendors to come back.
17	Like the govern the government doesn't have any money
18	and they're paying people money.
19	The Fairgrounds has \$50 million. They have a lot
20	of money in the bank. If they're not going to pay vendors
21	to come back, they should definitely not ask them for
22	money to come back.
23	If I were to tell the Fair Board members what to
24	do and they've and Fair Board members in the past have
25	come to me and said, "Mike, what do we do? What do we do

about the sale of the Fair? Or the Fairgrounds or what else?"

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This is what you do: You put it on the agenda next month that Spectra is going to get a dollar a That's how much they're going to pay -- for an empty parking lot for a year. And then they can do with it whenever they have to open. Whenever they can open, they can open. When they don't open, they don't open. And what they charge the vendors, that's up to them. Hopefully, they'll charge them nothing and hopefully everybody will come back to work and get some sense of community back to the community again in this incredible -- ridiculously incredible emergency that -that some people are missing in this particular instance, especially with -- with Market Place vendors and merchants who have been there for decades. And what's going on in the Market Place right now and the Fairgrounds and we want to bring these people back. And the Fair Board members can do this.

You put it on the agenda. You say one dollar a weekend for a year and you also have to consider the Fair -- the Fair vendors, too. Because it's going to come down to the Fair when the Fair comes around next year that they might need some support, too, and this might be the beginning of that. A whole concept of support for all of

1 the merchants that sell at the Fairgrounds all year long 2. for the next year or even a couple years. We have the 3 money. Let's use it. 4 The Fair Board members have the ability to say, "Let's use it. Let's do it now." Let's make sure America -- America and American merchants can survive this 6 -- this great emergency. And that's my pitch, you guys. And you can do it and this is the ability of the Fair 8 Board to do that, so I suggest --9 10 MADAM SECRETARY: Okay, Mike. That is time. 11 MR. ROBBINS: Okay. Stand up and do it, guys. 12 Thanks. 13 MADAM SECRETARY: Okay. Jerilynn, when you're ready. JERILYNN: Good morning, Board. My name is Jerilynn. 14 15 I'm a resident of Costa Mesa for the last 27 years. this is my first time coming to this meeting. 16 17 During my time in Costa Mesa, I've had the 18 pleasure of visiting the OC Fairgrounds on countless 19 occasions, enjoyed the Fair, and a plethora of other 20 special events the Fairgrounds offered. For that, I'd 21 like to thank each of the Board members for your service 2.2 to the Fairgrounds and for keeping it such a great family 23 place for our community. 2.4 My experience with the OC Fairgrounds began in 25 1992 when I attended the Steve Miller concert on a first Page 18

date. What a great evening that was. We had so much fun, and it was a night to remember as that handsome young man would later become my husband.

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After getting married, we rented an apartment on Elden Avenue that's right across the street from the Fairgrounds. We lived there for the next five years and I would regularly walk over to the swap meet every Saturday and Sunday and do my shopping with the regular and known vendors. Additionally, due to our close proximity to the Fairgrounds, we (unintelligible) free tickets to the Fair each year to come and enjoy the festivities every night.

Then in 1998, we purchased our first home in Costa Mesa and (unintelligible) but we continue to make our annual (unintelligible) to the fair. As well, our connection to the Fairgrounds became even stronger in the early 2000s when our church on the west side (unintelligible) (echo) temporary facility for our Easter services.

This is when we began our partnership with the OC Fairgrounds to utilize the amphitheater for our Easter services. Our church members will spend days in advance at the Fairgrounds setting up the stage, food, and preparations for the thousands of people who would be attending. 6	I think Michele did a very good job of
7	summarizing where we're at in terms of the financial
8	situation. And the Financial Monitoring Committee
9	continues to meet on a monthly basis or more often as
10	necessary. And I would have nothing to add to Michele's
11	earlier comments.
12	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you, Director La Belle. Next
13	is the Legislative Monitoring Committee. And that is
14	Director Aitken and Director Ruiz. Anything to report
15	Director Aitken or Director Ruiz?
16	DIRECTOR AITKEN: This is Director Aitken. Michele,
17	can you highlight the new email we just got from the
18	Governor's Office?
19	MS. RICHARDS: We just got an email this morning. Oh,
20	gosh. There we go.
21	CHAIR CERVANTES: We can always come back to it.
22	MS. RICHARDS: I got it here. Sorry.
23	There is a Press Advisory today at 11:30. A
24	press conference from from State Representative,
25	Josh Harder, who is introducing a bill today entitled,
	Page 26

1	"Protecting Fairs During Coronavirus Act" and it's a bill
2	to provide ongoing relief for fairgrounds that have been
3	hit very hard during coronavirus, so we will jump on to
4	that call at 11:30 to get more information and certainly
5	report out once we have that.
6	CHAIR CERVANTES: Okay. Great. Thank you.
7	And now we go to Governance Committee. And that
8	is Vice Chair Rubalcava-Garcia, and Director Bagneris is
9	not here.
10	VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Thank you. Just a brief
11	update.
12	So the Governance Committee met on June 30th to
13	review the final group of group Board policies. The
14	final edits were made and forwarded to legal for review.
15	The second meeting of the committee was held on
16	July 22nd to review Groups 3 and 5 policies. The
17	committee will complete the review at a later time, but we
18	are working on that.
19	The committee also discussed next steps to
20	include an open public meeting first to review Group 3
21	policies and then we will follow that by a second public
22	meeting to review Groups 4 and 5.
23	And we're doing this because the Group 3
24	policies as all the policies are very robust, but we
25	feel Group 3 will require some more time, so really just
	Page 27

1	want to break it up and allow the public to comment
2	in-depth on these.
3	Once all of the policies are reviewed by the
4	committee and legal, they will go to the full Board for
5	approval, then combine with Groups 1 and 2 which were
6	previously approved by the Board to create the complete
7	Board Governance Policy Manual.
8	Then just the follow-up piece; the
9	Governance Committee will continue the review process at
10	our next meeting which will be scheduled in a few weeks.
11	And that's all I have.
12	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you, Director
13	Rubalcava-Garcia. Now we go to the Facilities Committee.
14	And that is Director Aitken, and Director Pham is not
15	here.
16	DIRECTOR AITKEN: Hi. This is Director Aitken.
17	Ken is going to give us a highlight some of
18	the projects we have going on the property. One thing I
19	do want to highlight is we are at the very end of getting
20	our Audit Committee reports done. It's in big sections.
21	Ken was nice enough to deliver four of the largest binders
22	I've ever seen to me.
23	We are going to be having a meeting with CC&A
24	just to make sure that everything in it is correct as we
25	go through it. And then similar to governance, we're

1	going to be releasing them to the public, having public
2	meetings, so everyone feels they have time to digest it
3	and go through it in section by section, and going to be
4	soliciting public input at a public meeting.
5	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you, Director Aitken.
6	MR. KARNS: Thank you, Director Aitken and Chair
7	Cervantes.
8	That's the first section of the report from the
9	committee. I'll add a few other items from the meeting of
10	the Facilities Committee.
11	The Storm Water Management Project LOU with CCA
12	have been updated. So CCA will now work with successful
13	bidders, all the paperwork required, and to get the
14	project started. Facilities Director Jerry Eldridge will
15	work closely with CCA on these projects and keep
16	communication with the Equestrian Center and that's going
17	fine to-date.
18	The South Lawn Turf Project is complete and
19	looking great. And we might have a couple of photos to
20	pop up while I'm talking.
21	MS. RICHARDS: Ken. I'm so sorry. I'm trying to
22	erase this
23	(Overlapping speakers)
24	MR. KARNS: So that's looking good. Capital projects.
25	The fire alarm panel in the Costa Mesa building, that's

Т	being replaced. It's moving forward. CAL FIRE has
2	approved the drawings, and that is estimated to be
3	installed first week of August.
4	A couple of new items: Staff is working with
5	Spectra on removal of the (unintelligible) structure.
6	It's probably by this morning, it might be a hundred
7	percent complete.
8	CFSA carried out their annual inspection and the
9	team is working through any deficiencies. And once that's
10	all done, we'll get that all posted on our website. And
11	staff did send out a construction management level
12	letter approved by the Board of Directors. And that went
13	out to 142 Orange County CM firms. And that's
14	concludes the Facilities Committee report.
15	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you so much, Ken. And we move
16	to the next item which is San Diego County Fair Loan
17	Proposal Ad Hoc Committee. And that is Director La Belle
18	and Director Kovacevich.
19	DIRECTOR KOVACEVICH: I'd be happy to start.
20	So the committee did our diligence on the
21	proposal for the \$5 million loan to the 22nd DAA. We
22	posted our our including our recommendation. In
23	short, we we looked at this in, sort of, two ways.
24	One, the quantitative component where we dug in
25	deep to the financial economics behind the San Diego Fair.
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But that wasn't the only component. We also looked at our own finances. And, obviously, a big issue here is just a bunch of uncertainty of knowing how their operations would rebound, but also in knowing how our operations would rebound. And then what the likelihood that we'll be able to get paid back and when.

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I wanted to say, again, thank you to our

Friends and Neighbors of Orange County for the help in

providing some of this data that we were able to examine.

And also wanted to thank the 22nd DAA for being so open

with us and sharing their financial projections and plans

so that we could get a better grasp on this.

The second aspect that we looked at was a qualitative aspect. And that was considering, obviously, the relationship between the two Districts, the proximity, the -- the wantingness and willingness for us to be able to help a friend that's in need, but also internally -- our team, our staff -- being able to also try to measure what the impact of this loan would have internally from a qualitative standpoint.

And our conclusion that we came to was that due to the uncertainty -- when it comes to the economic side of this, both for the San Diego Fair and also for the Orange County Fair -- made it very difficult for us to get comfortable outlaying this amount of cash, especially

1 without knowing for certain that it will be coming back. 2. And even if it was fully repaid, those payments 3 would not be coming back here within the next year which is really still a big question mark for the OC Fair in 4 terms of what we're going to be able to do on our grounds 6 over the next year. And then coupled by -- when we look at the qualitative side, obviously, the willingness to help -- we 8 9 suggested -- we suggest other ways that we could help. 10 But, again, we came to the conclusion that lending \$5 11 million would have an adverse effect on our own morale, 12 given that we have employees that are participating in --13 in -- in pay cuts and -- and it's a trying time for 14 everybody right now. 15 So we felt that in order to keep morale and keep 16 everybody aligned, extending this loan was not in the best interest of that. 17 18 So in summary, we are recommending -- our 19 committee is recommending to the Board to not proceed with 20 the \$5 million loan to the 22nd DAA at this time. 21 CHAIR CERVANTES: Okay. Thank you, Director Kovacevich, and we'll come back to that for -- in vote as 2.2 23 an action item in just a quick second. 24 And just really quickly before the Entertainment 25 and Booking Services which is an ad hoc committee with Page 32

23	you.
24	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you so much. And now the
25	Entertainment Booking Services RFP Ad Hoc Committee.
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1 And that is Director Aitken and Director La Belle. 2. DIRECTOR LA BELLE: Chair Cervantes, just to indicate 3 that the first phase of the scoring process will take place next week. And subsequent to that, probably two to 4 three weeks later, interviews as appropriate will be held 6 with the committee. It's Reggie Mundekis speaking 10 regarding the proposed loan to the 22nd DAA. 11 I appreciate the work that everyone has put into 12 betting and underwriting this loan in determining if this 13 is a good action to take at this time, and I appreciate the sentiments of Director Kovacevich and La Belle in that 14 15 they went to look forward and find ways to best serve the 16 long-term interest of the 32nd DAA without putting us into 17 an untenable financial position by making a large loan to another agency. 18 19 I -- I also appreciate the offer of help from the 20 32nd DAA to the 22nd DAA going forward to assist them in 21 their activities. So as I've expressed before, this loan may not be in the best interest of the 32nd DAA. 2.2 It's not 23 clear how much real benefit is going to be for the 22nd 2.4 So I'd just like to thank everybody for their work 25 on this.

1	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you, Reggie.
2	MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you, Reggie. Jeanine Robbins,
3	when you're ready.
4	MS. ROBBINS: Actually, Summer, I didn't want to talk,
5	so I'm just going to pass it to Mike.

7	MR. ROBBINS: Hi. This is Mike Robbins again. I'll

11	This is the State of California's money. This is the
12	people of California's money. You have \$50 million in the
13	bank. Let's talk about fiscal responsibility. Your
L <b>4</b>	fiscal responsibility should be to protect merchants and
15	people out there business people people of
16	California who are working. People who want to work.
L 7	And at the Del Mar Fair, they need money right
18	now. And they shouldn't be alone. You got \$50 million in
19	the bank. You put it on the agenda to give them \$5
20	million to support them and the hundreds and thousands of
21	people who work at the Del Mar Fair. The same is at the
22	Orange County Fairgrounds. Now is the time. This is
23	about stepping up, about doing the right thing.
24	And if you have any questions about it, call up
25	the Governor. Call up the Governor and say, "Hey, we got

1	\$50 million in the bank. What should we do with it?
2	Should we give \$5 million to Del Mar Fair so that they car
3	continue to survive and have jobs for thousands of people?
4	Or should we not do that? You tell me, Governor, who
5	appointed me to this office. What should we do with the
6	\$50 million? Should we help these people? Or should we
7	let them just go by the wayside?"
8	It's up to you. This is about America. It's
9	about California. It's about everything. "It's about the
10	job you gave me to do. Now what should I do with it?"
11	Well, you guys know what to do with it. And if
12	you don't know what to do, call the Governor and ask him.
13	He'll tell you what to do with it to do with the 50
L <b>4</b>	million in the bank.
15	And I did get carried again. Thank you very
16	much. But really. I'm very serious. Put it on the
L 7	agenda. Give them \$5 million. If you have any questions,
18	call up the Governor who appointed you to the job to do a
19	job for the State of California, for the Fairgrounds that
20	you're appointed to.
21	Thanks so much for listening. Please do the
22	right thing. Thanks.
23	MADAM SECRETARY: Okay. Thank you, Mike.
24	Chair Cervantes, that's it for public comment on
25	Item 10B.

Thank you, Summer. 1 CHAIR CERVANTES: I will go ahead 2. and turn it over to Director La Belle and Director 3 Kovacevich and go into the action item vote. And with that, I would just conclude by saying 23 2.4 that it's the recommendation of the committee that we not 25 move forward with any loan to the 22nd DAA, but we work Page 38

It's already flying by. 11 Hopefully you've been tuning in online and our social 12 media and participating and have been seeing the many 13 great posts on social media taking place throughout each 14 day -- many times throughout each day. And you can raise your virtual hand if you participated in the Virtual Fair. 15 16 Social media has been extremely active thanks to 17 our Communications Department, and I think they really deserve a big round of applause (unintelligible) to get it 18 online and all of our social media outlets. And I wanted 19 20 to just provide you some of the snippet of things that 21 have been presented so far. First of all, I do want to thank the -- I'm sure 2.2 23 everyone saw the welcome by CEO Richards and several our of our Board members, Directors Aitken, Ruiz, Kovacevich, 24 25 Vice Rubalcava-Garcia who had some help from daughters Page 40

Sophia and Olive. So thank you for doing that to welcome and launch the Virtual Fair on the 17th.

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I wanted to show you the things that you have seen on social media. If you look at the bottom, there's a video. And that's our Instagram. And that's our friend, Frank Thurston, who has been performing his wonderful magic show at the Fair for over 25 years. And you have no doubt seen him do his shows -- as one of many shows that he does daily -- in the Explorioum.

And right here, you can learn something. You can -- you can learn to fly a pan using a simple rubber band. And I'm sure this will inspire a generation or two of some future magicians. By the way, I tried this, but I, obviously, need more practice because I wasn't able to do that.

And then Fair staff has gotten into the act. On the top right, you'll see Evy Young, our Agriculture Education Supervisor. And she did a tour of Centennial Farm with our mascot, Olivia. (Unintelligible) and Leslie is responsible for all the wonderful design and decor that you see on the grounds, not only at fair, but during Imaginology and throughout the year. So she's giving a presentation of how to make -- and those are the types of things that you would see decorated at our many gates and throughout the grounds. So you can learn how to

do that.

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And on the bottom right, you really can't see her very well but you can see her hand. That's our Culinary Specialist, Pam Wnuck, doing a demonstration using fruits and vegetables from Centennial Farm.

And then this is -- I wanted to show you some -- let's see if -- I can get that going. (Unintelligible) turn around here. I don't know if we can play that. I'm going to try this. This is from our Instagram. And what this is, it's one of our ice cream vendors showing how to make s'mores. A s'more sundae, actually. And so there's instructions on Instagram about how to replicate this dessert using store bought or homemade ingredients. And that was done in honor of National Ice Cream Day.

And then the next video is -- if we can get that, that's going to be a virtual ride on The Titan. And The Titan made it -- at the time, it was the tallest ride at the fair. And by the way, that's 17 stories high which is 30 feet taller (unintelligible). And for many of us, this might be the closest thing to actually getting on that ride. It's pretty exciting, but this is a really fun video to watch and you're actually -- you're going to feel that.

And then at the June Board of Directors meeting, I mentioned the online shopping. And I just wanted to

mention that again. And just show you just -- this is -just a few of the exhibitors. Just a handful, I should
say. There's many, many more online. But I did went to
give our merchants a shout out. And if you're craving
something and you were planning to buy something at the
2020 Fair, well, you can go online and do a little beach
home therapy and some shopping. So you won't miss out.

Next, I wanted to highlight a couple of our sponsors. We have two. Sleep Number which was \$5,000 in trade. And they provided an interactive game and donated product and prizes for contest. And we have a cash sponsorships of \$5,000 from Quiet Cool.

And I did want to mention -- while it's on sponsorship, I also want to mention that we will be sharing the proceeds from the revenue from the virtual fund as we do every year with the live fair. And that's 50 percent of the net proceeds and -- I'll talk about that in a couple of minutes. But it's going very well with participants, and we estimate to earn, I think, over about \$10,000 for the virtual. So along with the sponsorship and budget savings and the Virtual Fun Run, I think we got it covered the Virtual OC Fair budget that was approved.

Now going onto media. The Virtual Fair is receiving a wonderful amount of interest from the media -- meeting into and now during Virtual Fair by a social and

1 the press and all the major news outlets as you can see 2. here. You can go online and pull all those up. 3 And yesterday was our We Care Wednesday with our partnership with OC Goodwill and a very nice segment was 4 featured with -- on NBC 4 on your morning news. So some preliminary statistics. Now, we're still going through 6 7 it, so there's going to be more information to come, but I just wanted to give you a little -- a highlight of some of the stuff that we've had so far. 9 10 It ended up being 3,892 entries submitted by over 11 1,000 exhibitors and online judging is currently taking place. So that will be ongoing. And this will take some 12 13 time to complete. And we also created some special 14 judging categories. You need to Virtual Fair. 15 wanted to call out and thank a few people. I want to thank Directors La Belle and Aitken for volunteering to 16 17 judge this special category. And we also two community partners that are 18 19 judging -- helping to judge. And one is Dave Barton who 20 represents Arts Orange County. And Tracy Habiger from 21 City of Costa Mesa Recreation Department who we work with 2.2 on the ranch program. So those are some unique 23 categories. 2.4 As I mentioned earlier just a second ago,

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yesterday was We Care Wednesday and it was a day.

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1 incredible. Despite the pandemic, the community came out 2. to support Goodwill for the love of OC Fair and for a 3 coupon for one free fish taco generously donated by Wahoo's. And participated -- participants received a 4 voucher for the 2021 Fair. That was a really good day. 6 Some staff, some Goodwill. These are preliminary. 7 just got these last night. We'll have final reports by -hopefully by the end of the week. 8 9 But as of last evening, 3,222 people participated 10 in that program. And the top performing cities were 11 Orange, Brea, Placentia, Costa Mesa, Huntington Beach, and 12 Saddleback. 13 And then I wanted to talk about some stats on --14 that we're receiving on ocfair.com. So, you know, we 15 started promoting Virtual Fair a while back. So so far, as of yesterday -- for the month of July -- there's been 16 17 47,000 viewers. And now from July 17th -- when we started 18 the Virtual Fair -- that's been close to 30,000. We've had a lot of interest on ocfair.com. 19 20 And we also had over 200,000 page views. going back to the comparison from July 17th, that has been 21 2.2 and 101 -- sorry. 141,000 pages views since July 17th. So really -- has been due to the Virtual Fair. And 64 23 24 percent of the traffic is from mobile -- mobile devices.

And then coming in delving a little bit into

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social media as of yesterday, we're averaging about 8,000 people reach per post. We're posting two to three posts, plus multiple stories on Instagram and four to five posts, plus multiple stories on Facebook everyday. It's quite active.

8	healthy out there and, you know, hoping we get through
9	this pandemic. Again, everybody wear your mask. And
10	enjoy whatever we have left of the summer this COVID-19
11	summer, unfortunately. That's it. Thank you.
12	MADAM SECRETARY: Thank you, Director Ruiz. Director
13	Kovacevich?
14	DIRECTOR KOVACEVICH: Yeah. I wanted to just echo the
15	concerns of safety. Obviously we're seeing the numbers
16	here in California. And so, you know, now is the time to
17	actually be extra cautious when we were all hopping that
18	we would be returning somewhat to normal. So it's
19	unfortunate but encourage everyone to stay safe out there.
20	Also, wanted to thank everybody for the
21	attendance today. The comments from the public, thank
22	you. We certainly want to continue to be able deliver
23	value for our community and also honor or fiduciary
24	responsibility as directors.
25	Also, thank you Michele for your efforts to
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1	include the small business vendors in our Virtual Fair. I
2	think that's tremendous. We know it's a small thing, but
3	it just shows that, you know, we're willing to try to
4	think creatively in how to get people back in action. So
5	I think that means a lot. So that's all my comments.
6	Thank you, everyone.
7	CHAIR CERVANTES: Great. Thank you. Director
8	Rubalcava-Garcia?
9	VICE CHAIR RUBALCAVA-GARCIA: Thank you, Chair
10	Cervantes.
11	The only thing I wanted to add today is the
12	County of Orange has approved funding for restaurants that
13	are posting operating safely. So starting August 1st,
14	there will be a thousand dollar stipend or grant given to
15	businesses that are restaurants that meet a certain
16	concrete. So I just wanted to mention that. So if
17	there's any businesses that are on the call, that's always
18	something to look out for. It can cover any PPE related
19	expenses that the business approved during the March
20	through August period.
21	So I'll have more information. I'll share that
22	with Michele. She can hopefully put it on the website if
23	that's okay. But it will be a good incentive for
24	businesses to continue to operate safely so that we can
25	stay open and continue onto the recovery period that the

1	economy so greatly needs. And that's all I have for
2	today.
3	CHAIR CERVANTES: Thank you. Director Aitken?
4	DIRECTOR AITKEN: Thank you, everybody, for
5	participating today. And thank you for the kind comments
6	of support for our committee work. Stay safe, everybody.
7	I know we're trying to have as much fun as we can with the
8	fair. And I hope everybody is enjoying it. Please
9	support all the hard work of our Communications
10	Department. They're doing an amazing job.
11	CHAIR CERVANTES: Great. Thank you. And stay safe
12	and stay healthy. And, again, let's take care of each
13	other and the next Board meeting is August 27th, 2020.
14	See you then. Thank you. This meeting is adjourned.
