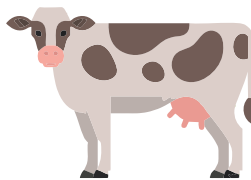

Can produce up to 10 gallons of milk a day.



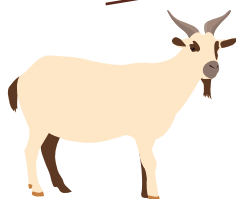
Tells you when it's morning.

Makes honey and pollinates plants.

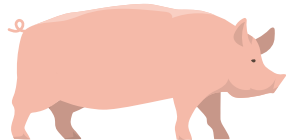
Pulls carts and helps farmers plow fields.

Produces milk that is an alternative to cow's milk.



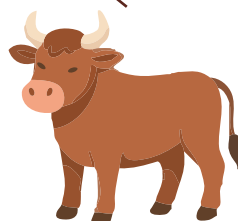
