HOLLYWOOD BURBANK AIRPORT (BUR)

16 miles | 25 minutes to Pasadena

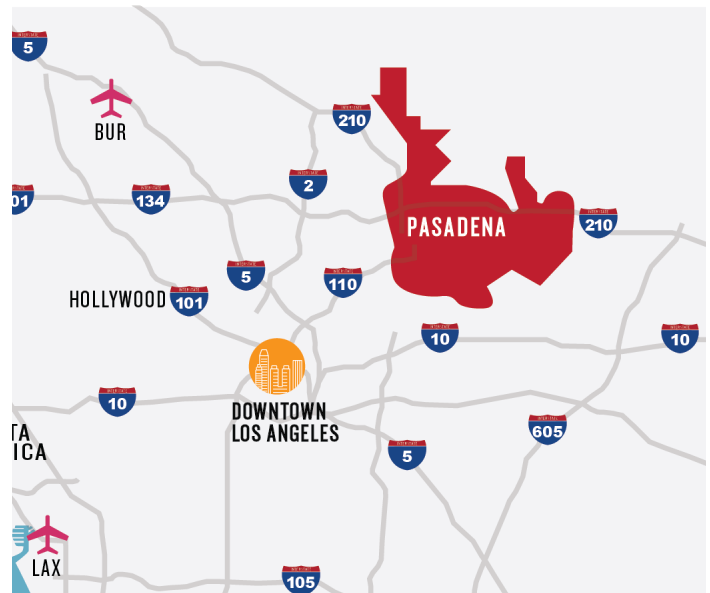
TRANSPORTATION TO/FROM PASADENA

METRO GOLD LINE

\$1.75 one-way fare

This light-rail system connects Pasadena's six stops to Union Station in downtown Los Angeles, and to communities to the east. From Union Station, other Metro and Amtrak rail systems offer access to the greater LA area. \$1.75 one-way fare. (\$2 TAP Card required)

PASADENA TRANSIT

\$0.75 one-way fare

The city's local bus system of six routes that travel between Old Pasadena, South Lake Avenue, the Playhouse Village, as well as surrounding cities. Conveniently, all routes connect to at least one Metro Gold Line station and \$0.75 one-way fare.
