
WELCOME TO PASADENA

FUN FACTS

The city of Pasadena is **22.5 square miles** with a population of 140,000 people, and 10% of the city's area is **historically** designated.

Celebrities from the area include Julia Child, Albert Einstein, Jackie Robinson, Sally Field, General Patton, and Mary See of See's Candies.

The **Rose Bowl Flea Market** attracts more than **2,200 vendors** with more than one million items for sale.

The **cheeseburger** was invented by Lionel Sternberger in Pasadena in 1926.

There are **23 parks** in Pasadena, totaling more than 1,000 acres of lush green space.

The first **Rose Bowl** college football game was played in 1902.

The former home of William Wrigley Jr., the founder of **Wrigley's Chewing Gum**, serves as the Tournament of Roses headquarters.

Amazon **parrots** are a unique and frequent sight around the city. Legend has it they are the descendants of a group that escaped a pet shop fire in the 1960s.

Pasadena has more than **600 restaurants**, showcasing cuisines from around the world.

Pasadena is home to Vroman's Bookstore, the oldest and largest **independent bookstore** in Southern California.

Ten (10) walking tours are available in Pasadena. Some of the most popular include Lower Linda Vista, Arroyo Craftsman, Arroyo View, and Old Pasadena.
