## **Academic Corner –**

### **Reading and Writing Tips**

#### **Stuffed Animal Research**

What would your child's stuffed squirrel like to eat? What kind of home does his turtle need? He/She can practice reading nonfiction and build early research skills as she/he finds out!

1. Together, find library materials that would answer his/her questions. You might try information books, picture book biographies, children's encyclopedias, or kids' science and nature magazines.
2. Help him/her read the table of contents and the glossary to see which pages contain the facts he wants. For instance, he/she could look for pages that mention *diet* or *habitat*.
3. Now it's time to use what he/she learned to "take care of" his animals. He/She might "serve" acorns to his squirrel. Or he/she can create a pond for his/her turtle using blue construction paper. She'll/He'll discover that doing research to learn new things is fun and useful!♥
