

⁶ So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, ⁷ rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.

Psalm 107:1-3 New International Version (NIV)

- ¹ Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever.
- ² Let the redeemed of the LORD tell their story those he redeemed from the hand of the foe,
- ³ those he gathered from the lands, from east and west, from north and south.

Isaiah 12:4-5 New International Version (NIV)

⁴ In that day you will say:

"Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done, and proclaim that his name is exalted.

⁵ Sing to the LORD, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world.
