KNOW IT



This weekend, we were reminded that when we ask God to meet needs, He often calls us to be part of the answer. Read and reflect on the following verses:

- Matthew 9:35-38 Why do you think Jesus invites His disciples to pray first instead of acting right away?
- Matthew 10:1-4 What stands out to you about how Jesus prepares His disciples before sending them?
- Matthew 10:5-15 What do you think He wanted them to learn by relying on others instead of themselves?
- Matthew 10:16-20 What might it look like to trust the Holy Spirit to give you the words or courage in a difficult moment?




