#### 1. AB 1572 Non-Functional Turf Ban on Commercial, Industrial, and Institutional Properties

Governor Newson signed into law AB 1572 which prohibits the use of potable water for the irrigation of non-functional turf (NFT) on commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) properties, declaring it wasteful and incompatible with state policy relating to climate change, water conservation, and reduced reliance on the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta ecosystem. The ban will take effect in a phased approach between 2027 through 2031.

NFT includes turf areas that are decorative and serve no other functions. The ban also applies to common areas of homeowners' associations, common interest developments, and community service organizations or similar entities. AB 1572 does not affect residential lawns, parks, sports fields, cemeteries, or golf courses, nor does it prohibit the use of potable water necessary to ensure the health of trees or to address an immediate health and safety need. AB 1572 makes permanent a temporary drought-related emergency regulation banning the irrigation of NFT at CII properties that was put in place in June 2022 and is set to expire in June 2024.

#### Bill Enforcement

AB 1572 authorizes a public water system, city, or county to enforce the new law. Primary enforcement authority is provided for Urban Retail Water Suppliers, with noncompliance subject to civil liability and penalties of up to \$500, or those imposed by a local ordinance. In the event an Urban Retail Water Supplier is not enforcing the new law, Public Water Systems (such as Valley Water) may also take enforcement action upon notifying the appropriate retail public water system 30 days before enforcement. Valley Water's Water Waste Program will continue to serve as a county-wide intake platform for water waste reports and will follow the procedures outlined in ordinance No. 23-02.

#### Week of December 22, 2023-January 3, 2024

#### Valley Water Ordinance No. 23-02

A ban on irrigating NFT is included in Valley Water ordinance No. 23-02, which lists water waste prohibitions and defines enforcement measures for water conservation in Santa Clara County. The provisions of AB 1572 align with Valley Water's ordinance.

#### Compliance Resources

AB 1572 requires the state to support small and minority-owned businesses by providing services that advance compliance with the provisions; additionally, the bill requires the Department of Water Resources to prioritize financial assistance for NFT replacement to public water systems serving disadvantaged communities.

Valley Water's Landscape Rebate Program will be available to assist properties to comply with AB 1572 by providing rebate funding for the conversion of NFT to low-water-use landscapes.

### 3. Two-day Rinconada Water Treatment Plant shutdown from January 16, 2024 to January 18, 2024

Starting on January 16, 2024, the Rinconada Water Treatment Plant (RWTP) will be shut down for two (2) days to facilitate Rinconada Reliability Improvement Project work. During this shutdown, the project team will perform electrical and pipeline tie-in activities at the head-works of the Plant. Valley Water (VW) staff will also take this opportunity to perform other preventive maintenance and improvement activities. Performing periodic preventive maintenance is essential to ensure that the water treatment plant's critical systems are safe, reliable and remain in good working order.

During this shutdown, all West Pipeline (WPL) turnouts normally supplied by RWTP, except for the City of Mountain View, are expected to be impacted. Barring any unforeseen circumstances, the RWTP is scheduled to return to service on January 18, 2024.

The above-stated shutdown schedule has also been communicated and coordinated with all WPL retailers. The retailers impacted by this shutdown will use their groundwater and/or alternate supplies to meet demand.
